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February Meeting Actions

The Kansas Board of Healing Arts held its regularly scheduled meeting on Friday, the 19th of February, and took several actions.

The Board reviewed and approved settlement agreements on the following medical professionals: Regina Marshall-Dixon, RT; Maureen Sweers, OT; John Wanjigi, PTA; Meckson Makundi, RT; Nora Gomez, MD; Robin Reed, MD; William King Kelly, MD; Donald Ray Cook, MD; Ron Laughrey, RT; Everett Sitzman, Jr, MD.

The Board reviewed an Initial Order rendered by the Office of Administrative Hearings following a conference hearing regarding Christopher Ceman, MD. They voted to accept the Initial Order and moved to approve it as the Final Order.

The Board heard the application for licensure from Yvrose Archange, MD. This matter was tabled until the next meeting in April.

The Board heard the case regarding Christie M. Mensch, MD. The Board approved a non-disciplinary resolution.

The Board heard the request by Richard Pustka, PA, for reinstatement of licensure. The Board approved reinstatement after viewing proof of CEU's.

Arthur Paul Greenberg, MD, requested to have his license reinstated. The request was granted by the Board.

The matter of the license of Percy Myers, MD, was granted a continuance.

Emanuel Joseph, Jr, MD, was granted a license through endorsement. The applicant is fully licensed in AL, GA, ME, KY, MI, and TN.

The case of John P. Gorecki, MD, was granted a continuance until the April Board meeting.

The Board discussed the matter of the license of Corrie Nevil, MD. Probation was terminated.

The request by Douglas Geenens, MD, for a lengthened amount of time in which to pay his fines and costs, was considered by the Board. The Board agreed to allow Dr. Geenens one year in which to pay his fines and three years in which to pay the costs of his investigation.

The Board heard and considered the request by Steven Donnenwerth, MD, to terminate the chaperone requirement in his Consent Order. The Board granted his request.

The matter of William Hodge, MD was brought before the Board. Dr. Hodge requested a continuance until the April board meeting. The request was granted.

The matter of a consent order for Bert Chronister, MD, was reviewed by the Board. The Board determined that Dr. Chronister had successfully completed all requirements.

The matter of Bradley Eck, DC, was brought before the Board. The Board fined Dr. Eck \$500 for non-timely payment of original fine and restitution from a February, 2009 order.

The matter of licensure for Ann Marie Swink, LRT, was continued until the April Board meeting.

Intiaz Rasul, MD, requested the Board grant him an institutional license with a waiver that his medical school must have been in existence for a minimum of 15 years (It has been in existence for 14 years and 2 months). Institutional licensure was granted.

Robert Francis Rusnak, DC, the Board accepted the surrender of his license and assessed costs of \$332.50. In addition, the Board assessed investigation costs of \$4,627.98.

John Schroll, MD requested modification of his Consent Order to terminate his probation and continue the other terms under a monitoring arrangement. The Board voted to grant the removal of probation.

Larry Beamer, MD requested modification of his Consent Order to terminate his probation and continue the other terms under a monitoring arrangement. The Board voted against the removal of probation.
