

Dr. Jones was requested to have Dr. Richard J. Hattrup write a letter verifying that Dr. Jones will be working with him if his license is reinstated. Also, what Dr. Hattrup will expect of Dr. Jones with regard to the number of hours he will be working and the number of patients he will be handling. Dr. Jones is to request a letter from Alcoholics Anonymous as to the fact that he has been attending meetings regularly.

C. Robert McGuire, investigator, is to check in the Wichita area for any information about Dr. Jones.

The meeting was adjourned until June 17, 1978, at 9:00 a.m.

XII. Revocation Hearings:

LeRoy Alcox, M.D.

Dr. Alcox' license has been revoked in the state of New Mexico because of leaving the state with incomplete hospital charts. Dr. Alcox appeared in his own defense.

(Doctor-Hill) Move that the license of Dr. Alcox be revoked as of today, that the revocation be stayed pending a period of one year in order to enable Dr. Alcox to have his license reinstated in New Mexico. In the event that he is able to have his license reinstated, the revocation of his Kansas license will be lifted. Carried.

Joseph W. Dennis, M.D.

The license of Dr. Dennis has been revoked in the state of California because of emotional illness. Dr. Dennis did not appear at the Hearing but did write a letter to the Board requesting a 6 months continuance, at which time he would know if his license in California will be reinstated.

(Hill-McKelvey) The request for a continuance by Dr. Dennis be denied. Carried.

(Hill-Doctor) That the license of Dr. Dennis be revoked on the basis of the revocation of his California license. An explanation to be included in the notification to Dr. Dennis stating that he will be able to apply for reinstatement of his Kansas license at the end of one year. At that time the Board should be informed of the status of his California license. Carried.

XIII. Rules and Regulations for licensure by endorsement from a foreign country:

A discussion was held concerning the necessity of writing Rules and Regulations for licensure by endorsement from another country. Many suggestions were made and the Attorney will promulgate the Rules and Regulations in the proper form for the Board's approval.

XIV. Change in Rules and Regulations #100-6-2 3(b) (2):

(Doctor-McKelvey) The following addition be made to K.A.R. 100-6-2 3(b) (2): A doctor of osteopathic medicine and surgery shall present proof to the Board that he has completed a postgraduate training program of not less than one year's duration approved by the American Osteopathic Association "or the equivalent, when approved by the Osteopathic branch of the Board." Carried.
