FINAL ORDER FOLLOWING RECONSIDERATION

NOW ON THIS Fourteenth Day of August, 1999, comes before the Board for a conference hearing Respondent's request for reconsideration of the Board's Final Order dated June 21, 1999. Respondent Randall R. Beech, M.D. appears in person. Stacy L. Cook, Litigation Counsel, appears for Petitioner.

After hearing the arguments of the parties, and having the agency record before it, the Board finds and concludes that the Final Order should be modified as follows:

- The Kingman Community Hospital is in need of a person licensed to practice
 medicine and surgery and who is trained and experienced as a general surgeon.

 The hospital is interested in utilizing Respondent in that capacity under terms and
 conditions established by the Board.
- 2. The Board finds that the public health, safety and welfare in the Kingman, Kansas community is served by modifying the Final Order to terminate the suspension and in its place impose appropriate limitations upon Respondent's license.

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED that, the suspension of Respondent's license is terminated effective August 14, 1999, and that Respondent's license shall be limited for an indefinite period of time. Specifically, the location in which Respondent may engage in the

practice medicine and surgery is limited to Kingman Community Hospital. Additionally,

Respondent may not prescribe any controlled substance, except that he may order a controlled substance if it is to be administered at Kingman Community Hospital.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that any controlled substance that Respondent orders as allowed by this Final Order be reported to the Board in the same manner as the Final Order issued by the Board on June 15, 1998.
