**FINAL ORDER GRANTING TERMINATION  
OF LIMITATION**

NOW on this 13th day of December 2013, comes before the Kansas State Board of Healing Arts ("Board") the request of Richard J. Bono Jr., M.D. ("Licensee") for termination of the limitation contained in the Consent Order filed on March 9, 2012. Licensee appears in person and *pro se*. Jane Weiler, Associate Litigation Counsel, appears on behalf of the Respondent Board.

Pursuant to the authority granted to Board by K.S.A. 65-2801 *et seq.* and in accordance with the provisions of the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act K.S.A. 77-501 *et seq.*, the Board hereby enters this Final Order in the above-captioned matter. After reviewing the agency record, hearing the statements and arguments of the parties, and being otherwise duly advised in the premises, the Board makes the following findings, conclusions and order:

1. Richard J. Bono Jr., M.D. ("Licensee") is licensed to engage in the practice of medicine and surgery in the State of Kansas, having been issued License No. 04-35643.
2. As a condition of being granted licensure, Licensee entered into a Consent Order with the Board which was filed on March 9, 2012, that imposed a limitation on Licensee's license requiring practice monitoring.
3. On April 25, 2012, the Board accepted and ratified the Consent Order.

4. Under the Limitation terms of the Consent Order, Licensee agreed to have his practice of medicine and surgery monitored for one (1) year.
5. The terms of the Consent Order allowed Licensee to petition the Board for modification or termination after one (1) year.
6. On or about October 15, 2012, a quarterly report which consisted of the review of eight (8) patient records was submitted.
7. On or about January 14, 2013, Licensee submitted to the Board a request for an extension of the quarterly reports which was denied.
8. On or about April 17, 2013, the Board sent a letter to Licensee reminding him of his practice monitoring requirements pursuant to his Consent Order, and requesting the January and April practice monitor quarterly reports.
9. On or about April 24, 2013, Licensee submitted six (6) reports of the review of patient records encompassing the previous two (2) quarterly reporting periods.
10. On or about April 29, 2013, Licensee submitted one (1) report of review of patient records.
11. On or about July 12, 2013, a quarterly report which consisted of the review of for (4) patient records was submitted.
12. On or about October 11, 2013, a quarterly report which consisted of the review of for (4) patient records was submitted.
13. On or about October 11, 2013, Licensee submitted a request to the Board for termination of the practice monitoring requirement contained in the Consent Order.
14. On November 15, 2013, the Respondent Board filed a Response to Petition for Termination of Practice Limitations.

15. Based on the evidence presented, the Board finds that Licensee has satisfactorily met all requirements of the Consent Order and concludes that termination of the limitation on his license is warranted.

**IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED, BY THE KANSAS STATE BOARD OF HEALING ARTS** that the **LIMITATION** imposed by the Consent Order filed on March 9, 2012, which required practice monitoring is hereby **TERMINATED**.

**PLEASE TAKE NOTICE** that this is a Final Order. A Final Order is effective upon service, and service of a Final Order is complete upon mailing. Pursuant to K.S.A. 77-529, Licensee may petition the Board for Reconsideration of a Final Order within fifteen (15) days following service of the final order. Additionally, a party to an agency proceeding may seek judicial review of a Final Order by filing a petition in the District Court, as authorized by K.S.A. 77-601, *et seq.* Reconsideration of a Final Order is not a prerequisite to judicial review. A petition for judicial review is not timely unless filed within **30 days** following service of the Final Order.
