

V. Administrative Proceedings:

8:30 a.m. Burton Cox, D.O.: Dr. Cox appeared in response to investigative subpoena and proceedings were held in public meeting.

(Wedel-Greene) Accept offer of surrender of license made by Dr. Cox which will be reported as a revocation, and authorize Executive Director to execute stipulation when signed by Dr. Cox and to issue Enforcement Order pursuant thereto.

9:00 a.m. Richard Bradbury, DPM:

Conference proceedings were held based on Dr. Bradbury's application for license to practice podiatry. The court reporter recorded the proceedings.

(Waxman-Buller) Accept PMLexis Examination taken and passed in Iowa, as being an acceptable examination for licensure in Kansas. Carried.

(Philipp-Buller) Change current policy for podiatry applicants and require an oral interview, but not an oral examination, with PMLexis, regardless of where taken, as acceptable for licensure in Kansas. Carried.

Non-Public Session: (Knackstedt-Kerbs) 9:15 a.m.

9:00 a.m. Gary Forshee, D.C.: Dr. Forshee appeared in response to investigative subpoena. Court reporter was present.

(Bletz-Greene) Reasonable cause exists that Dr. Forshee has violated Healing Arts Act. Approve the following stipulation recommendations: Revoke license for one year; revocation be stayed; fine \$2,500.00 and this to be paid within 30 days. If Dr. Forshee violates Act again, summary revocation be instituted. Dr. Forshee is to file a verifying report with the Litigation Counsel every quarter that he does have liability insurance and will have for the next quarterly period; that he provide a sworn statement that he will maintain insurance. This report is due by the 10th day of the month following quarterly period; all communication with Board will be by certified mail. If reporting lapses, this will be grounds for summary revocation. Authorize Executive Director to execute Stipulation when signed by Dr. Forshee and to issue Enforcement Order pursuant thereto. Carried.
