SUMMARY ORDER

NOW ON THIS 14 day of April, 2016, this matter comes before Kathleen Selzler Lippert, Executive Director, Kansas State Board of Healing Arts (“Board”), in summary proceedings pursuant to K.S.A. 77-537.

Pursuant to K.S.A. 77-537, this Summary Order shall become effective as a Final Order, without further notice, if no request for hearing is made within fifteen (15) days of service.

Upon review of the agency record and being duly advised in the premises, the following findings of fact, conclusions of law and order are made for and on behalf of the Board:

Findings of Fact

1. Katie D. Bratman (“Permittee”) was originally issued the special permit No. 19-00549 to practice as a student respiratory therapist in the State of Kansas on or about August 4, 2015. Permittee’s current special permit designation is active.

2. Permittee’s last known mailing address as provided to the Board is: **Confidential**
Confidential Overland Park, Kansas 66213.

3. On or about February 5, 2016, Board staff sent a letter through the United States Postal Service, First-Class with postage pre-paid to Permittee that requested Permittee provide to the Board, proof of current enrollment in an approved school of respiratory therapy and an

anticipated graduation date, on or before March 7, 2016, Permittee had failed to submit to the Board the required documents.

4. On or about March 15, 2016, the Board staff sent a second letter through the United States Postal Service, First-Class with postage pre-paid to Permittee that requested Permittee to provide to the Board, proof of current enrollment in an approved school of respiratory therapy and an anticipated graduation date, on or before March 31, 2016.

5. Permittee has not submitted to the Board documentation evidencing current enrollment in an approved school of respiratory therapy and an anticipated graduation date by the second due date of March 31, 2016.

Applicable Law

6. K.S.A. 65-5510(a) states in pertinent part:

The board may deny, refuse to renew, suspend, revoke or limit a license or the licensee may be publicly or privately censured where the licensee or applicant for licensure has been guilty of unprofessional conduct which has endangered or is likely to endanger the health, welfare or safety of the public. Unprofessional conduct includes:...(4) violating any ... rule or regulation of the board.

7. K.A.R. 100-55-9(c) states in pertinent part:

During February of each year, each student who holds a special permit shall provide the following to the board: (1) Verification of current enrollment in an approved school of respiratory therapy; and (2) a statement of the anticipated graduation date.

Conclusions of Law

8. The Board has jurisdiction over Permittee as well as the subject matter of this proceeding, and such proceeding is held in the public interest.

9. The Board finds that Permittee violated K.S.A. 65-5510(a) in that Permittee violated a rule and regulation of the Board. Specifically, Permittee violated K.A.R. 100-55-9(c)(1) and (2) in that she failed to submit to the Board documentation evidencing current enrollment in an approved school of respiratory therapy and an anticipated graduation date.


10. Based on the facts and circumstances set forth herein, it appears that the use of summary proceedings in this matter is appropriate, in accordance with the provisions set forth in K.S.A. 77-537(a), in that the use of summary proceedings does not violate any provision of the law and the protection of the public interest does not require the Board to give notice and opportunity to participate to persons other than Permittee, Katie D. Bratman.

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED that the Special Permit to practice respiratory therapy issued to Permittee is **CANCELLED** for Permittee's violations of the Respiratory Therapy Practice Act.

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that upon becoming effective as a Final Order, this document shall be deemed a public record and be reported to any reporting entities authorized to receive such disclosure.


