ORDER GRANTING SECOND TEMPORARY PERMIT

NOW, on this 13th day of February, 1993, comes on for conference proceedings the request of Deborah Kay Brown, PA (hereafter "Registrant") to grant Second Temporary Permit pursuant to K.S.A. 65-2896d.

Charlene K. Abbott, Licensing Administrator to the Board, appears on behalf of the Board. Registrant appeared in person pro se.

After reviewing the files, hearing statements of Registrant and being duly advised in the premises, the Kansas State Board of Healing Arts (hereafter "Board) makes the following findings of facts, conclusions of law and order:

1. A request for a Second Temporary Permit was filed by Deborah K. Brown, PA on February 9, 1993.
2. Notice of Conference Hearing setting this matter for hearing at 9:00 a.m. on February 13, 1993 was waived by Registrant upon her signature on a Waiver of Notice of Conference Hearing.
3. Registrant has applied for permanent registration as a physician assistant, but has not passed an exam approved by the Board as required by K.S.A. 65-2896a(a)(3).

4. Registrant was granted a temporary permit number 9248354 which expired on February 15, 1993.

5. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-2896d, not more than one Temporary Registration shall be permitted to any one person without the majority approval of the members of the Board.

6. Registrant should be granted a Second Temporary Registration until the Board results from the NCCPA examination to be administered in October, 1993 become available.

7. In addition, Registrant is required to, within thirty days of this Order, provide to the Board office a written plan outlining the steps she intends to take to enhance passage of the examination in October, 1993. Further, the Board requests a written recommendation by Registrant's current responsible physician.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that, A Second Temporary Registration be granted to Deborah Kay Brown until March 13, 1993 and if the written documentation described in paragraph seven above is provided by said date, the Second Temporary Registration be extended until the results from the NCCPA examination to be administered in October, 1993 become available.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that in the event Registrant fails to pass the NCCPA examination to be administered in October, 1993, the Second Temporary Registration hereby granted to Registrant should expire and be cancelled as of the date the failure becomes available to the Board.


IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that this is a Final Order and is effective upon service upon the parties. Any party may, within 15

days after service, file a Petition for Reconsideration. The filing of a Petition for Reconsideration is not a prerequisite for seeking administrative or judicial review.
