ENFORCEMENT ORDER

NOW, on this 18th day of October, 1986, this matter comes before the Board as a result of a Stipulation having been entered into between the Board and the above-named licensee.

The Kansas State Board of Healing Arts is represented by its General Counsel, Lawrence T. Buening, Jr. There are no other appearances.

After examining the files, hearing the statements of counsel and being otherwise duly advised in the premises, the Board finds as follows:

1. That on or about November 8, 1984, Licensee was convicted in the District Court of Ford County Kansas of aggravated battery, a Class C Felony; and on or about June 25, 1986, the Supreme Court of the State of Kansas denied Licensee's petition for review and Licensee is now exhausted all of his rights to appeal said conviction in the State of Kansas.

2. That Licensee is currently licensed to practice medicine and surgery in the State of Kansas and is the holder of certificate #13834, most recently renewed June 5, 1986 for the period ending June 30, 1987.

3. That the conviction of the aforementioned crime constitutes an act for which the Board may revoke, suspend or limit the license of Licensee.

4. That in lieu of proceeding with formal adjudicative proceedings to revoke, suspend or limit the license of Licensee, the Board and Richard L. Brownrigg, M.D. have entered into a Stipulation, a true copy of which is attached hereto, and which the parties have agreed to the resignation and surrender of Licensee's license to practice medicine and surgery in the State of Kansas, from and after the effective date of the Stipulation.

5. It is understood and agreed that Licensee, upon release from incarceration he is serving as a result of the conviction of the aforementioned felony, may apply for reinstatement of license #13834, provided all conditions as indicated in the attached Stipulation are satisfactorily met.

IT IT THEREFORE BY THE BOARD ORDERED, ADJUDGED AND DECREED:

A. That the findings hereinabove made be and the same are made the order and decree of the Board.

B. That Richard L. Brownrigg, M.D. shall comply with and abide by all of the terms and conditions set forth in the Stipulation attached hereto.

C. That any violation of the Stipulation by Richard L. Brownrigg, M.D., during the time the Stipulation remains in effect

shall constitute prima facie evidence of a violation of the Healing Arts Act and disciplinary proceedings may be initiated against said individual for the revocation, suspension or limitation of the license held to practice medicine and surgery in the State of Kansas.

STIPULATION

THIS AGREEMENT made and entered into this 27 day of August, 1986 by and between the KANSAS STATE BOARD OF HEALING ARTS (hereinafter referred to as "Board") and RICHARD LEE BROWNRIGG, M.D. (hereinafter referred to as "Licensee").

WITNESSETH:

WHEREAS, on or about November 8, 1984, Licensee was convicted in the District Court of Ford County Kansas of aggravated battery, a Class C Felony; and

WHEREAS, on or about June 25, 1986, the Supreme Court of the State of Kansas denied Licensee's petition for review and Licensee is now exhausted all of his rights to appeal said conviction in the State of Kansas; and

WHEREAS, the Licensee is currently licensed to practice medicine and surgery in the State of Kansas and is the holder of certificate #13834 most recently renewed June 5, 1986 for the period ending June 30, 1987; and

WHEREAS, the conviction of the aforementioned crime constitutes an act for which the Board may revoke, suspend or limit the license of Licensee; and

WHEREAS, in lieu of proceeding with formal adjudicative proceedings to revoke, suspend or limit the license of Licensee, the parties mutually desire to enter into this Stipulation.

NOW, THEREFORE, in consideration of the forbearance of additional investigation, and formal adjudicative proceedings and the other covenants and promises contained herein, the parties hereto agree as follows:

1. Licensee hereby resigns and surrenders his license to practice medicine and surgery in the State of Kansas, said license being #13834, and Licensee further relinquishes all of the rights accorded to him by said license. From and after the effective date of this Stipulation, the license of Licensee shall be null and void and Licensee shall no longer have the privilege to practice medicine and surgery in the State of Kansas.

2. It is understood and agreed that the surrender and resignation of Licensee's license is for all time, provided, however, that at any time following Licensee's release from incarceration he is serving as a result of the conviction of the aforementioned felony, Licensee may apply for licensure by complying with the applicable rules and regulations of the Board then in effect pertaining to granting of licenses and reinstatement of revoked licenses, by fulfilling the conditions

set forth in paragraph 3 hereof and by demonstrating he has been sufficiently rehabilitated to warrant the public trust.

3. The Board will give no consideration to any application for license or for an application for reinstatement of a license hereby surrendered unless and until Licensee fulfills the following conditions and provides to the Board satisfactory evidence thereof, to wit:

A. Confidential

B. Licensee has provided to the Board a copy of his parole and/or probationary terms and conditions.

C. Licensee has satisfactorily completed such program of continuing education as may be approved by the Board to insure the clinical competency of Licensee to resume the practice of medicine and surgery.

4. Upon completion of the requirements set forth in paragraph 2 and 3 hereof, the Board will give any request by Licensee for licensure or for reinstatement of license due consideration, provided, however, nothing in this Stipulation shall be construed as requiring the Board to so license or reinstate the license of Licensee or to issue Licensee a license without restriction.

5. This Stipulation constitutes the entire agreement between the parties and there are no agreements, promises or understandings regarding any matter in question herein other than that expressly set forth.

6. Licensee has entered into this Stipulation freely and voluntarily and has not been subjected to any duress or coercion to enter into the same.

7. Licensee acknowledges his rights to due process and hearing pursuant to the Kansas Administrative Procedures Act, but by the execution of this Stipulation expressly waives such rights.

8. This Stipulation and the surrender and resignation of Licensee's license shall remain in full force and effect until rescinded by order of the Board.

IN WITNESS WHEREOF, the parties hereto have executed this Stipulation on the date indicated below their signature, it being expressly understood that this Stipulation shall not become effective until it has been signed by both of the parties hereto.
