FINAL ORDER LIMITING LICENSE

NOW on this 8th day of August, 2014, comes on for conference hearing before the Kansas State Board of Healing Arts ("Board") the Petition for discipline filed against the physical therapist assistant certificate of Nicolette E. Capell, PTA ("Certificant"). Reese H. Hays, Litigation Counsel, appears on behalf of the Petitioner Board. Certificant appears in person and pro se.

Pursuant to the authority granted to the Board by the Physical Therapy Practice Act, K.S.A. 65-2901 et seq., and in accordance with the provisions of the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act K.S.A. 77-501 et seq., the Board hereby enters this Final Order in the abovecaptioned matter. After reviewing the agency record, hearing the statements and arguments of the parties, receiving exhibits into evidence, and being otherwise duly advised in the premises, the Board makes the following findings, conclusions and order:

- 1. Certificant is presently licensed to practice as a physical therapist assistant in the State of Kansas, having been issued Certificate No. 14-02340 on or about May 25, 2012.
- 2. The Petition alleges that on approximately October 16, 2012, Certificant was arrested for driving under the influence (DUI) in Roeland Park, Kansas, and subsequently convicted on March 16, 2013, in the Municipal Court of Roland Park, Kansas.
- 3. The Petition also alleges that this was Certificant's second DUI arrest, with the first DUI arrest occurring in Boone County, Missouri, in 2008, and resulting in a diversion.

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6. The Petition alleges that Certificant violated K.S.A. 65-2912(a)(1), Confidential

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7. The Petition also alleges that Certificant violated K.S.A. 65-2912(a)(5), for

unprofessional conduct as further defined by K.A.R. 100-29-12(a)(2), for practicing physical

therapy without reasonable skill and safety because of ... Confidential

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that impairs judgment or ability to provide care.

8. The Petition further alleges that Certificant violated K.S.A. 65-2912(a)(5), as

further defined by K.A.R. 100-29-12(a)(18), for acts of unprofessional conduct, specifically for

committing conduct likely to harm the public by operating a motor vehicle with a breath alcohol

content in excess of .08.

9. K.A.R. 100-29-12(a)(18) defines one type of unprofessional conduct as

"commiting conduct likely to deceive, defraud or harm the public."

10. The Board's purpose in regulating the practice of physical therapist assistants is to

ensure that the public, as existing and potential patients, are properly protected from unfit

individuals and unprofessional conduct committed by its licensees and certificants. The Board

concludes that, based on the specific facts of this matter, Certificant's act of driving under the

influence of alcohol in and of itself is not sufficiently correlated to the violation of conduct likely to harm the public as alleged.

11. The Board concludes there is insufficient evidence Confidential

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is sufficient evidence demonstrating that Certificant has a that impairs judgment or ability to provide care as set forth in

K.A.R. 100-29-12(a)(2)(D).

14. The Board concludes that a licensure limitation Confidential

Confidential for three (3) years is warranted in order to ensure Certificant is safe to practice as a physical therapist assistant.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED, BY THE KANSAS STATE BOARD OF HEALING ARTS that Certificant's certificate to practice as a physical therapist assistant is hereby LIMITED for a period of at least three (3) years, during which Certificant shall be required to:

- g. Certificant shall furnish a copy of this Final Order to each and every state licensing agency in states where Certificant is licensed, certified or registered to practice as a physical therapist assistant; and
- h. Certificant shall notify the Board's Compliance Coordinator of any criminal arrest, citation or charge filed against her or of any conviction for any traffic or criminal offenses within five (5) days of occurrence.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that after a period of (3) years, Certificant may request

termination of the LIMITATION on her certificate to practice as a physical therapist assistant.

For any period of time that Certificant is not actively practicing as a physical therapist assistant

in Kansas, the LIMITATION requirements shall remain in effect, but will be tolled and not

counted towards reducing the three (3) year timeframe.
