FINAL ORDER FOLLOWING CONFERENCE HEARING

NOW on this // day of August, 2002, comes on for conference hearing before the Kansas State Board of Healing Arts ("Board") the Application for Licensure to practice medicine and surgery in the state of Kansas filed by Felipe A. Cecena, M.D. ("Applicant").

Charlene K. Abbott, Licensing Administrator, presented information before the Board. Applicant appeared in person *pro se*.

After reviewing the file, hearing the statements and being otherwise duly advised in the premises, the Board finds as follows:

- On June 5, 2002, Applicant filed an Application for Licensure to receive a license to practice medicine and surgery in the state of Kansas.
- As part of the Application, Applicant provided evidence that he had graduated from the Facultad de Medicina, Universidad Nacional Autonoma de Mexico on December 31, 1962.
- Facultad de Medicina Universidad Nacional Autonoma de Mexico is not an accredited medical school.
- 4. K.S.A. 65-2873(c)(2) provides that an applicant from school that is not accredited may be granted a licensed if the applicant has completed three years of postgraduate training as approved by the Board.

5. The Board has adopted K.A.R. 100-6-2(b) that requires applicants who graduated from

an unaccredited school of medicine provide proof completion of postgraduate training approved by

the council of education of the American medical association or its equivalent.

6. Only one year of Applicant's postgraduate training meets the requirement of K.A.R. 100-

6-2-(b)

7. Applicant has obtained licenses to practice medicine and surgery in the states of Colorado

and Arizona; has been practicing medicine and surgery since since 1969; and has been a director of

a cardiovascular interventional fellowship program.

8. Applicant's experience is equivalent to an approved year of postgraduate training.

9. Applicant meets the requirements for licensure under K.S.A. 65-2873 and K.A.R. 100-6-

2(b) and is eligible for a license.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the above findings are made the order of the Board

and that Applicant is eligible for a license to practice medicine and surgery under the provisions of

K.S.A. 65-2873.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that the temporary permit granted to Applicant on July 12,

2002, is extended to October 12, 2002, at which time the Board will grant a permanent license to

Applicant.
