**FINAL ORDER**

**NOW ON THIS** 17th day of April, 2009, this matter comes on for hearing on the petitioner's, The Kansas State Board of Healing Arts, Petition to Revoke License. Licensee appears in person, *pro se*. Kelli Stevens, Associate Litigation Counsel, appears for the Board. There are no other appearances.

Having the agency record before it, hearing the statements and arguments of the parties and being duly advised in the premises, the Board finds, concludes and orders as follows:

1. On or about July 31, 2007, Licensee's medical staff appointment and privileges were revoked at a health care facility in Kansas. The revocation was made retroactive to January 31, 2007.
2. Revocation of medical staff appointment and privileges is grounds for disciplinary action pursuant to K.S.A. 65-2836(s).
3. As part of a disciplinary action against Licensee's Missouri license, Licensee was required to pass the Federation of State Medical Board's Special Purpose Examination ("SPEX") or become recertified by either

the American Board of Internal Medicine or the American Board of Gastroenterology within six (6) months.

4. On or about April 23, 2008, Licensee took the SPEX and failed to achieve a passing score.
5. Failure to pass the SPEX is grounds for disciplinary action pursuant to K.S.A. 65-2836(b) as defined by K.S.A. 65-2837(a)(3).
6. On or about October 28, 2008, Licensee's Missouri license was revoked.
7. Revocation of a license to practice the healing arts in another jurisdiction is grounds for disciplinary action pursuant to K.S.A. 65-2836(j).


**IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED** that Licensee's license to practice medicine and surgery is suspended for violation of K.S.A. 65-2836(b),(j) and (s).

**IT IS FURTHER ORDERED** that this suspension shall be indefinite or until such time as Licensee achieves a passing score on the SPEX, has his license reinstated in Missouri and petitions the Board to lift the suspension.

**PLEASE TAKE FURTHER NOTICE** that this is a final order. A final order is effective upon service. A party to an agency proceeding may seek judicial review of a final order by filing a petition in the District Court as authorized by K.S.A. 77-601, et seq. Reconsideration of a final order is not a prerequisite to judicial review. A petition for judicial review is not timely unless filed within 30 days following service of the final order. A copy of any petition for judicial review must be served upon the Board's Executive Director at 235 SW. Topeka Blvd., Topeka, KS 66603.


