**ORDER DENYING RECONSIDERATION OF ORDER
OF CANCELLATION OF LICENSE**

NOW on this 9th day of October, 1993, comes on for reconsideration before the Kansas State Board of Healing Arts (hereinafter "Board") sitting as a whole the request by Leslie A. Chorun, M.D. (hereinafter "Applicant") to reconsider the Proposed Default Order of Cancellation of License. Applicant does not appear.

After reviewing the request and being otherwise duly advised in the premises, the Board makes the following findings of fact:

1. Applicant was originally licensed to practice medicine and surgery in the State of Kansas on October 31, 1992.
2. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-2809 and K.A.R. 100-15-1, licenses to practice medicine and surgery expire on June 30 of each year and may be renewed annually upon the request of the licensee by providing a request for renewal on a form provided by the Board.
3. K.S.A. 65-2809(d) requires that at least 30 days before expiration of a license the Board notify licensee of the expiration of a license by mail to licensee's last address as noted in Board

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records. Upon failing to renew by the expiration date the Board will suspend action for 30 days following the date of expiration and provide a second notice to licensee that licensee's license has expired.

4. On May 14, 1993, in accordance with the statutory provisions, Applicant was mailed the form necessary to renew her license which was addressed to her last address noted in Board records. This first notice was never returned to the Board office.

5. On July 20, 1993, a second notice indicating Applicant's license had expired and that the Board would suspend action on the license for 30 days following expiration of said license was mailed. Said second notice was discovered by Applicant in late August or early September of 1993. Delay in responding to this notice apparently resulted due to flood conditions affecting the area of Applicant's residence. Applicant returned said notice to the Board, which was received in the Board office September 20, 1993.

6. In accordance with K.S.A. 65-2809(d) and 77-520, a Proposed Default Order of Cancellation of License was mailed August 12, 1993 and received by Applicant on August 24, 1993 at her residence address. The delay in receiving said Order was due to Applicant's change of address, of which the Board was not notified.

7. The Proposed Default Order of Cancellation provided it would become effective upon expiration of seven days following service if a written motion requesting said Order be vacated was

not received during said period.

8. On August 23, 1993, pursuant to the Proposed Default Order of Cancellation of License, Applicant's license to practice medicine and surgery was cancelled.

9. By letter dated September 15, 1993, and received in the Board office September 20, 1993, Applicant requested reconsideration of the Proposed Default Order of Cancellation of License.

10. By letter dated September 24, 1993, Applicant submitted an application for renewal together with a check made payable to the Board dated September 24, 1993 in the sum of \$200.

IT IS THEREFORE BY THE BOARD ORDERED that Applicant's request to reconsider and vacate the Proposed Default Order of Cancellation of License should be denied.


IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Applicant should be required to comply with the requirements necessary to reinstate her license in order to again have a valid license to practice medicine and surgery in the State of Kansas.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that this is a Final Order and is effective upon service on the parties. Any party may, within 15 days after service, file a Petition for Reconsideration. The filing of a Petition for Reconsideration is not a prerequisite for seeking administrative or judicial review.

IT IS SO ORDERED.
