ENFORCEMENT ORDER

NOW, on this 17th day of August, 1991, this matter comes on for consideration before the Kansas State Board of Healing Arts (hereinafter referred to as "Board") and William J. Ciskey, M.D., (hereinafter referred to as "Licensee") as a result of a Stipulation and Agreement having been entered into between the Board and the above-named Licensee on August 17, 1991.

After reviewing the files and being otherwise duly advised in the premises, the Board finds as follows:

1. That the Board and Licensee have entered into a Stipulation and Agreement, a true copy of which is attached hereto as "Exhibit A" and incorporated herein as if fully set forth.

2. That the attached Stipulation and Agreement should be approved and all conditions, terms and provisions set forth in the Stipulation and Agreement shall be adopted as Findings of Fact and Conclusions of Law and the order of the Board.

IT IS THEREFORE BY THE BOARD ORDERED AS FOLLOWS:

That the findings hereinabove made be and the same are made the order of the Board.

That Licensee's license to engage in the practice of medicine and surgery in the State of Kansas is hereby suspended for a period of twenty-four (24) months. The twenty-four month (2 years) suspension period shall be calculated by adding the number 2 to the year 1991 in association with the date of this Enforcement Order as issued by the Board making the Stipulation and Agreement an Order of the Board. The entire twenty-four (24) months of the suspension shall be stayed upon Licensee's agreement to abide by the following probationary limitations, restrictions and conditions:

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Licensee's license to engage in the practice of medicine and surgery in the State of Kansas is hereby conditioned and limited. Such limitation is set forth in the following paragraph:

i) Licensee shall within three hundred sixty-five (365) days of the effective date of this Stipulation and Agreement attend and successfully complete the mini-residency medical education course, "The Proper Prescribing of Controlled Dangerous Substances" sponsored by the University of Medicine and Dentistry of New Jersey School of Osteopathic Medicine in Camden, New Jersey. Licensee shall stand all associated costs for transportation and attendance at said mini-residency. Licensee shall have all evaluation reports, documentation, grades and attendance reports forwarded to the attention of the Board.

ii) Licensee shall have his license to engage in the practice of medicine and surgery restricted for a minimum of three-hundred sixty five (365) days in that Licensee shall not be allowed to prescribe, dispense, administer or otherwise give, sell or barter any Schedule II narcotic to any individual to include patients under his direct care and supervision without prior authorizing co-signature from

Licensee's supervising physician. Licensee shall be afforded the right to petition for modification of this provision at the expiration of 365 days. This restriction is applicable to Licensee and all circumstances except for as set forth in subparagraph iv.

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vi) CONFIDENTIAL

vii) The Kansas State Board of Healing Arts reserves the right to modify for additional conditions all elements of the Stipulation and Agreement CONFIDENTIAL

Licensee shall enter into a Kansas Healing Arts compliance monitoring program with an accepted and authorized supervising physician within fourteen (14) calendar days of the date of acceptance of the Stipulation Agreement and shall remain in such supervisory relationship for a period of not less than three

hundred and sixty five (365) days from the date of this agreement. The proposed supervisory agreement between Licensee and the supervising physician shall be approved by the Board or Board designee. The supervisory period shall begin upon the approval of the supervisor and supervisory agreement by the Board or the Board designee. Prior approval must be obtained by the Board or the Board designee for any request of change in the supervisory agreement or designated supervisor. In the event not within the control of the Licensee regarding the change of supervisor the Board or the Board designee shall be notified within five (5) calendar days by Licensee. The focus of the supervisory relationship shall be a review of Licensee's ongoing professional practice in medicine and surgery in compliance with Kansas Healing Arts Act. Supervisory reports from the supervising physician shall be submitted to the Board or Board designee every quarter due on the tenth (10th) calendar day of the month immediately following the quarterly period. The quarterly report shall contain information to include the overall practice of Licensee and his compliance or non-compliance with all provisions of the Kansas Healing Arts Act. Such supervisory agreement must be submitted to the Board or Board designee no later than the fourteenth (14th) calendar day after the signing of the Stipulation and Agreement for such to approved by the Board or Board designee. Licensee shall meet with the supervising physician no less than two (2) one (1) hour sessions per month. The first reporting period shall end

September 31, 1991 with the first report due October 10th, 1991. Such quarterly supervisory reports shall include the prior authorization for administration dispensing of any Schedule II drugs in Licensee's professional practice.

Licensee agrees to take responsibility for causing the above quarterly reports to be submitted to the Board or Board designee.

Licensee shall maintain a record of all Schedule II controlled substances prescribed by him to include the following: (1) the name and address of each patient; (2) the date the controlled substance was prescribed; (3) the name and quantity of controlled substance prescribed; and (4) the diagnosis, symptom, treatment modality or regime necessary to prescribe the controlled substance. The supervising physician referred to above shall monitor the administration of all controlled drugs and countersign any record maintain by Licensee on a bi-monthly basis.

In addition to the supervisory reports as set forth under the Kansas Healing Arts Act Compliance Monitoring Program, Licensee shall additionally submit quarterly reports stating that he has been in compliance with all conditions of the Stipulation and Agreement with such reports being due on the tenth (10th) calendar day immediately following the quarterly period.

Licensee shall obey all federal, state and local laws and rules governing the practice of medicine in the State of Kansas.

All correspondence and/or communication with the Board or Board designee as specified in the Stipulation and Agreement shall

mean that Licensee must utilize certified mail addressed to the Kansas State Board of Healing Arts at 235 S. Topeka Boulevard, Topeka, Kansas 66603. Licensee has an affirmative duty to notify the Board of changes in his personal or professional status which would inhibit the compliance with the above conditions


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or any conditions set forth separately by the Board in the Stipulation and Agreement and this Enforcement Order.


Licensee shall abide by the terms as set forth in the Stipulation and Agreement.


