

JOURNAL ENTRY OF SATISFACTION OF CONSENT ORDER

COMES NOW the Kansas State Board of Healing Arts ("Board"), by and through its Executive Director, Kathleen Selzler Lippert, a duly authorized representative of the Board, in accordance with the provisions of the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act, K.S.A. 77-501 *et seq.*, as amended, and upon due consideration of the agency record and applicable statutes and regulations, and being otherwise duly advised in the premises, makes the following determinations:

1. On or about October 27, 2011, Licensee entered into a Consent Order with the Board for alleged violations of the Kansas Respiratory Therapy Practice Act, K.S.A. 65-5501, *et seq.* The Consent Order required Licensee attend and successfully complete a continuing education course for ethics, and attend and successfully complete a continuing education course for record keeping. Licensee was required to provide the Board documentation evidencing completion of these courses on or before January 31, 2012.

2. On or about April 26, 2013, Board designee, Dr. Terry Webb, modified the requirements of the Consent Order. Dr. Webb amended requirements of the Consent Order based on the lack of live in-person record-keeping courses and lack of live in-person ethics courses for respiratory therapists, and the costs associated with attending similar courses intended for another allied health profession.

3. The new requirements for the Consent Order required Licensee to complete eight (8) hours of on-line continuing educational units related to record-keeping of patient care. Following completion of the continuing education, Licensee was required to write a 500-word essay addressing how the information would affect her documentation of patient care in the future.

4. Further, the new requirements for the Consent Order required Licensee to complete four (4) hours of on-line continuing educational units related to ethics regarding the care of patients. Licensee was required to write a 500-word essay regarding how the information would affect her professional responsibility to care to patients in the future.

5. On or about June 3, 2013, Licensee submitted the appropriate amount of continuing educational units, and both of the required essays to the Board.

6. Licensee has satisfactorily met all requirements of the Consent Order and has no further obligation for compliance.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that Licensee is hereby discharged from all requirements of the Consent Order filed on October 27, 2011.
