OF REQUIREMENTS OF FINAL ORDER**



1. On or about February 23, 2010, the Board issued a Final Order addressing concerns about Licensee's engaging in unprofessional conduct. The Final Order contained a provision for Licensee to pay a civil fine in the amount of \$150 due and payable within thirty days of the effective date of the Summary Order, which was February 9, 2010.
2. Licensee paid the \$150 fine on February 22, 2010.
3. Licensee has satisfied all requirements of the Final Order and has no further obligation for compliance.

**IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED** that Licensee is hereby discharged from the requirements of the Final Order filed on February 23, 2010.



1. On January 20, 2010, the Interim Executive Director issued a Summary Order regarding the license of Robin S. Cooper, O.T.A. ("Licensee") to practice as an occupational therapy assistant in the State of Kansas. Such Summary Order was served on January 21, 2010, by depositing the same in the United States Mail first-class postage prepaid to Licensee's last known address.

2. The Summary Order contained a notice that a written request for hearing could be filed within 15 days following service, but if no hearing is requested, the Summary Order would be come effective as a final order of the Board upon expiration of the time for requesting a hearing.

3. No hearing has been requested by any party therefore the Summary Order became effective as a Final Order on February 9, 2010.





**SUMMARY ORDER**

NOW ON THIS 20<sup>th</sup> day of Jan, 2010, this matter comes before Kathleen Selzler Lippert, Interim Executive Director, Kansas State Board of Healing Arts ("Board"), in summary proceedings pursuant to K.S.A. 77-537. This Summary Order shall become effective as a Final Order, without further notice, upon the expiration of the fifteen (15) day period if no request for hearing is made, pursuant to K.S.A. 77-542.

Upon review of the agency record and being duly advised in the premises, the following findings of fact, conclusions of law and order are made for and on behalf of the Board:

**Findings of Fact**

1. Robin S. Cooper, O.T.A. ("Licensee") was originally issued license number 18-00435 to practice as an occupational therapy assistant in the state of Kansas on May 28, 1999. Licensee's license is currently active.
2. Licensee's last known mailing address as provided to the Board at the time of her application for reinstatement is 5001 Payne, Shawnee, Kansas 66226.
3. On or about May 7, 2009, the Board received an application from Licensee for reinstatement of her occupational therapy assistant license. Licensee's license had been cancelled for

failure to renew on May 1, 2009.

4. In section 6 of her application, Licensee lists all professional activities since the cancellation of her license. Licensee states that she worked as an OTA for Lakeview Village in Lenexa, Kansas from May 1, 2009 to May 20, 2009. Licensee states that on May 4, 2009, she realized that she was practicing occupational therapy assistance unlicensed.

5. Licensee's license was reinstated on June 1, 2009. Licensee worked from May 1, 2009 until May 20, 2009 as an occupational therapy assistant without being properly licensed.

#### **Applicable Law**

6. K.S.A. 65-5410 states, in pertinent part: (a) The Board may deny, refuse to renew, suspend, revoke or limit a license or the licensee may be publicly or privately censured where the licensee or applicant for licensure has been guilty of unprofessional conduct which has endangered the health, welfare or safety of the public. Unprofessional conduct includes:

(2) being guilty of unprofessional conduct as defined by rules and regulations adopted by the board;

(c) The board, in addition to any other penalty prescribed in subsection (a), may assess a civil fine, after proper notice and an opportunity to be heard, against a licensee for unprofessional conduct in an amount not to exceed \$5000 for the first violation. . . .

7. K.A.R. 100-54-5 Unprofessional conduct; defined. Unprofessional conduct means any of the following:

(o) committing conduct likely to deceive, defraud or harm the public

#### **Conclusions of Law**

8. The Board has jurisdiction over Licensee as well as the subject matter of this proceeding, and such proceeding is held in the public interest.

9. That by continuing to be employed as an occupational therapy assistant from May 1, 2009 to May 20, 2009, Licensee was holding herself out to the public as an individual properly licensed by the Kansas State Board of Healing Arts to assist in the practice of occupational therapy, by doing so Licensee engaged in conduct likely to deceive, defraud or harm the public in violation of K.S.A. 65-5410(2) in combination with K.A.R. 100-54-5.

10. The Board finds that Licensee engaged in unprofessional conduct as defined by K.A.R. 100-54-5 by continuing to be employed as an occupational therapy assistant without being properly licensed.

11. Based on the facts and circumstances set forth herein, it appears that the use of summary proceedings in this matter is appropriate, in accordance with the provisions set forth in K.S.A. 77-537(a), in that the use of summary proceedings does not violate any provision of the law and the protection of the public interest does not require the Board to give notice and opportunity to participate to persons other than Licensee, Robin S. Cooper, O.T.A.

**IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED** that Licensee is hereby assessed a civil fine of \$150.00 due and payable within thirty days of the effective date of this Order.

#### **NOTICE AND OPPORTUNITY FOR HEARING**

**PLEASE TAKE NOTICE** that this is a Summary Order. A party to whom a Summary Order is issued may file a written request for a hearing pursuant to K.S.A. 77-542 within 15 days following service of the Summary Order. Such written request shall also state the legal and/or factual basis upon which the party opposes this Order. If a hearing is not requested, the Summary Order shall become effective as a Final Order of the Board upon expiration of the time for requesting a hearing. A written request for hearing must be addressed and mailed to Kathleen Selzler Lippert,




