ORDER OF EMERGENCY SUSPENSION OF LICENSE

NOW, on this 13th day of March, 1989, the above-entitled matter comes before the Kansas State Board of Healing Arts (hereinafter referred to as "Board") pursuant to K.S.A. 65-2338 and K.S.A. 77-536 by and through its Executive Director, Richard G. Gannon, finds as follows:

I. FINDINGS OF FACT

1. That, **Stephan S. Corder, M.D.** (hereinafter referred to as "Licensee") is currently licensed to practice medicine and surgery in the State of Kansas and holds certificate number 18093, originally issued on June 15, 1979.

2. That, information was brought to the attention of the Disciplinary Counsel of the Board and the Executive Director of the Board that indicated Licensee may be unable to practice medicine and surgery with reasonable skill and safety to patients.

3. That, these matters were caused to be investigated by Joseph M. Furjanic, Disciplinary Counsel and reviewed by Richard G. Gannon, Executive Director of the Board, acting for the Board.

4. That, the Board found there was cause to believe that Licensee had violated the Kansas Healing Arts Act in the following respects:

a. That, the Licensee has the inability to practice the branch of the healing arts for which Licensee is licensed, with reasonable skill and safety to patients **(Confidential)**

5. That, the aforementioned findings constitute cause to believe that the actions and conduct of the Licensee violated K.S.A. 1988 Supp. 65-2836 to 64-2844 inclusive and amendments thereto and thereby may result in the revocation, suspension, or limitation of license of Licensee.

**II. CONCLUSIONS OF LAW AND POLICY REASONS**

6. That, there is cause to believe that grounds exist under K.S.A. 1988 Supp. 65-2836 and 65-2844 inclusive and amendments thereto for the revocation, suspension, or limitation of the license of Licensee.

7. That, due to the alleged violations of the Kansas Healing Arts Act by Licensee, there is an immediate and imminent danger to the public health, safety, or welfare which can only be prevented or avoided by the immediate suspension of Licensee's license.

8. That, the necessary action which must be taken by the Board to prevent or avoid the immediate danger to the public health, safety and welfare is to suspend the license of Licensee and thereby prohibit Licensee from practicing medicine and surgery in the State of Kansas while he remains in violation of the Kansas Healing Arts Act as above stated.

**NOW THEREFORE**, it is by the Board considered and ordered:

9. That, the findings, conclusions of law and policy reasons hereinabove made and set forth be and the same are hereby made the order of the Board.

10. That, the license of the Licensee is hereby suspended.


