FINAL ORDER

NOW, on this 20th day of February, 2009, the above-entitled matter comes on before the Kansas State Board of Healing Arts ("Board") for conference hearing on Licensee's application for change of status from Inactive to Federal Active. Licensee appears in person with counsel, Michael J. Wyatt of Klenda, Mitchell, Austerman & Zuercher, L.L.C.. Kathleen Selzler Lippert, Litigation Counsel, appears for the Board. **(Confidential)**

(Confidential) There are no other appearances.

WHEREUPON, Licensee moves to have a proposed consent order entered into evidence. There being no objections, the exhibit is entered and marked as "Exhibit A."

WHEREUPON, Licensee waives any objection to members of the Disciplinary Panel participating in deliberations and decisions in this matter.

WHEREUPON, Licensee is duly sworn and testifies under oath.

WHEREUPON, having the agency record before it, having heard the testimony of Licensee **(Confidential)** having heard the statements and arguments of counsel and having been duly advised in the premises, the Board FINDS, CONCLUDES and ORDERS as follows:

FINDINGS OF FACT

1. On or about February 27, 1991, Licensee was issued License No. 04-23494 entitling her to practice medicine and surgery in the State of Kansas. Licensee's license is currently Inactive.

2. On or about August 12, 2008, Licensee submitted an Application for Change of Status from Inactive to Federal Active.

3. In October 2007, the South Carolina Medical Board suspended Licensee's medical license (Confidential)

13. On or about October 1, 2008, South Carolina lifted the suspension on Licensee's license.

14. Licensee and Board staff agree in principle to limiting Licensee to supervised practice.

15. Licensee requests that the limitation be stayed for a period of one (1) year, lifted if licensee has no other problems, and not reported to any physician reporting entities.

16. Licensee and Board staff have suggested Consent Orders, each to the other, which are substantially similar except for the staying and reporting of limiting Licensee to a supervised practice setting.

CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-2836(j), the suspension of her license in South Carolina is grounds to discipline Licensee in Kansas and does not subject the licensee to double jeopardy or “piling on.”

3. Licensee can be granted a Federal Active License subject to reasonable limitations without subjecting patients to undue risk.

4. Licensee’s request to stay or otherwise not report a practice limitation is inconsistent with the Board’s duties to protect the citizens of Kansas and adequately inform the public of Board actions.

5. The other provisions of the Consent Order suggested by Board Staff and the Consent Order suggested by Licensee are fair, just and equitable.

ORDERS

1. Licensee is granted a Federal Active License to practice medicine and surgery in the State of Kansas subject to the following conditions and limitations:

a. Licensee is hereby placed on probation for a period of five (5) years. This probation is not self-terminating. After a period of five (5) years, Licensee may petition the Board for modification or termination of the probation. For any period of time that Licensee is not actively practicing medicine and surgery in Kansas, the probation will remain in effect, but will be tolled and not counted towards reducing the five (5) year time-frame.

j. Licensee will furnish a copy of this Final Order to each and every state in which she holds licensure or applies for licensure and to an appropriate work site supervisor or personnel (Confidential)

k. Licensee shall immediately notify the Board or its designee of any citation, arrest or charge filed against her or of any conviction for traffic or criminal offenses throughout the duration of the probation.

l. Licensee shall at all times keep Board staff informed of all her current practice locations, addresses and telephone numbers. Licensee shall provide the above information in writing to the Board with ten (10) days of any such change throughout the duration of the probation.

m. (Confidential)

For any period of time that Licensee is not actively practicing medicine and surgery in Kansas, the monitoring provisions will remain in effect, but will be tolled and not counted towards reducing the five (5) year time-frame.

n. Licensee's license is hereby LIMITED in that for a period of at least one (1) year, Licensee is prohibited from engaging in the solo practice of medicine and surgery. After a period of one (1) year, Licensee may request modification or termination of this limitation. For any period of time that Licensee is not actively practicing medicine and surgery in Kansas, the limitations provisions will remain in effect, but will be tolled and not counted towards reducing the one (1) year time-frame.

PLEASE TAKE FURTHER NOTICE that this is a final order. A final order is effective upon service. A party to an agency proceeding may seek judicial review of a final order by filing a petition in the District Court as authorized by K.S.A. 77-601, et seq. Reconsideration of a final order is not a prerequisite to judicial review. A petition for judicial review is not timely unless filed within 30 days following service of the final order. A copy of any petition for judicial review must be served upon the Board's Executive Director at 235 SW. Topeka Blvd., Topeka, KS 66603.
