SUMMARY ORDER

NOW ON THIS 25 day of June, 2013, this matter comes before Kathleen Selzler Lippert, Executive Director, Kansas State Board of Healing Arts ("Board"), in summary proceedings pursuant to K.S.A. 77-537.

Pursuant to K.S.A. 77-537, this Summary Order shall become effective as a Final Order, without further notice, if no request for hearing is made within fifteen (15) days of service.

Upon review of the agency record and being duly advised in the premises, the following findings of fact, conclusions of law and order are made for and on behalf of the Board:

Findings of Fact

1. Naoma Crisp-Lindgren, M.D. ("Licensee") was originally issued license number 04-23494 to practice medicine and surgery in the state of Kansas on or about February 27, 1991. Licensee's current license designation is federally active, and such license was last renewed on or about June 11, 2012.

2. Licensee's last known mailing address as provided to the Board is **Confidential**
Confidential Wichita, Kansas 67205.

3. On or about March 8, 2012, the South Carolina State Board of Medical Examiners filed a Formal Complaint against Licensee, alleging **Confidential** which

violated her monitoring agreement with the South Carolina State Board of Medical Examiners.

4. On or about March 8, 2012, Licensee received a copy of the Formal Complaint filed against Licensee by the South Carolina State Board of Medical Examiners.

5. On or about June 11, 2012, Licensee submitted an online application to renew her license to practice medicine and surgery in Kansas.

6. In her June 11, 2012 renewal application, Licensee answered "No" to Disciplinary Question C. Disciplinary Question C asks, "In the past 12 months has any disciplinary action been initiated or taken against you by a state licensing agency or other state or government agency, or have you surrendered or consented to limitation of license to practice in any state or country?"

7. As part of the renewal process, Licensee certified that, under a penalty of perjury, that the information provided by Licensee was true, correct and complete to the best of Licensee's knowledge. Further, Licensee certified that Licensee understood that Kansas statutes allow the State Board of Healing Arts to revoke, suspend or limit a license, or censure the licensee for any act of fraud or misrepresentation in applying for renewal of a license.

Applicable Law

8. K.S.A. 65-2836 states in pertinent part:

A licensee's license may be revoked, suspended or limited, or the licensee may be publicly or privately censured . . . upon a finding of the existence of any of the following grounds:

(a) The licensee has committed fraud or misrepresentation in applying for or securing an original, renewal or reinstated license.

Conclusions of Law

9. The Board has jurisdiction over Licensee as well as the subject matter of this proceeding, and such proceeding is held in the public interest.

10. The Board finds that Licensee violated K.S.A. 65-2836(a) by committing fraud or misrepresentation in the renewal of Licensee's license to practice medicine and surgery in the State of Kansas, when Licensee answered fraudulently to Disciplinary Question C of her State of Kansas Renewal Application. Licensee answered "No" to Disciplinary Question C when in fact she should have answered yes because Licensee had been given notice by the South Carolina State Board of Medical Examiners that a Formal Complaint had been initiated prior to Licensee completing her State of Kansas renewal form.

11. Based on the facts and circumstances set forth herein, it appears that the use of summary proceedings in this matter is appropriate, in accordance with the provisions set forth in K.S.A. 77-537(a), in that the use of summary proceedings does not violate any provision of the law and the protection of the public interest does not require the Board to give notice and opportunity to participate to persons other than Licensee, Naoma Crisp-Lindgren, M.D..

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED that Licensee is hereby **PUBLICALLY CENSURED** for Licensee's violation of the Healing Arts Act.

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that upon becoming effective as a Final Order, this document shall be deemed a public record and be reported to any reporting entities authorized to receive such disclosure.

NOTICE OF RIGHTS

(Pursuant to K.S.A. 77-542)

Licensee is entitled to a hearing pursuant to K.S.A. 77-537 and K.S.A. 77-542, the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act. If Licensee desires a hearing, within fifteen (15) days from the date of service of this Order, Licensee must file a written request for a hearing with the office of the Executive Director at:

If a hearing is not requested in the time and manner stated above, this Summary Order shall become effective as a Final Order upon the expiration of time for requesting a hearing, pursuant to K.S.A. 77-542. Pursuant to K.S.A. 77-613(e), the Executive Director is the agency officer designated to receive service of petition for judicial review on behalf of the agency.


