FINAL ORDER

NOW, on this 31st day of July 2009, this matter comes before John (Jack) Confer, Executive Director of the Kansas State Board of Healing Arts. After reviewing the file and being advised in the premises, the Executive Director makes the following determinations.

1. On June 2, 2009 the Executive Director issued a Summary Order regarding the license of William Rodney Dodds, D.C. ("Licensee") to practice chiropractic in the state of Kansas. The Summary Order contained a provision assessing a \$500 civil fine against Licensee, due payable on or before July 8, 2009

2. On June 2, 2009 the Executive Director issued a Summary Order regarding the license of William Rodney Dodds, D.C. ("Licensee") to practice chiropractic in the state of Kansas. The Summary Order contained a provision for the Licensee to complete 16 hours of Category I continuing education, due on or before September 2, 2009

3. The Summary Order contained a notice that a written request for hearing could be filed within 15 days following service, but if no hearing is requested, the Summary Order would be come effective as a Final Order of the Board upon expiration of the time for the requesting a hearing.

4. No hearing has been requested by any party; therefore the Summary Order became effective as a final order on July 8, 2009



SUMMARY ORDER

NOW ON THIS *2nd* day of *June* ~~May~~, 2009, this matter comes before John (Jack) Confer, Executive Director, Kansas State Board of Healing Arts ("Board"), in summary proceedings pursuant to K.S.A. 77-537.

After reviewing the agency record and being duly advised in the premises, the following findings of fact, conclusions of law and order are made for and on behalf of the Board:

1. William Rodney Dodds, DC ("Licensee") was originally issued license number 01-04476 to practice chiropractic medicine in the State of Kansas on August 16, 1997, pursuant to K.A.R. 100-15-1.
2. K.A.R. 100-15-5 requires each Licensee desiring to renew a Chiropractic license to submit to the Board documented evidence of completion of a minimum of 50 contact hours of continuing education with a minimum 20 hours category and maximum 30 hours category II since July 1, 2007, or 100 contact hours of continuing education 40 hours category and maximum 60 hours category II since July 1, 2006, or 150 contact hours of continuing education 60 hours category and maximum 90 hours category II since July 1, 2005, before or with the request for renewal.
3. On or about January 11, 2009, Licensee submitted an application for renewal of their license.

4. As part of the renewal process, Licensee certified that the rules regarding proof of continuing education had been read, that 50 hours of continuing education hours had been achieved, and that documentation of those hours would be maintained for a three-year period and produced to the Board upon request.

5. As part of the renewal process, Licensee further certified that the notice regarding the Board's procedures for auditing continuing education compliance had been read.

6. Licensee was randomly selected to provide verification of compliance with the continuing education requirements and on February 20, 2009, a letter was mailed to Licensee requesting that Licensee provide no later than March 31, 2009, the records relied upon when Licensee certified achievement of the required continuing education hours.

7. On March 24, 2009, Licensee provided documentation of the achievement of 12 hours of category I and 30 hours of category II.

8. On March 26, 2009, a letter was mailed advising the Licensee that he was deficit 8 hours of category I.

9. Licensee was sent Certified Mail through the United States Postal Service and 2nd notice letter for the hours on April 22, 2009.

10. Licensee signed in receipt of the 2nd notice letter on April 24, 2009.

11. Licensee failed to provide documented evidence of 20 hours of category I continuing education hours since July 1, 2007.

12. By failing to provide documented evidence of his continuing education, Licensee has violated K.S.A. 65-2836(r), failing to respond to the Board's legal request for information.

13. In addition to any other penalty prescribed under the healing arts act, K.S.A. 65-2863a authorizes the Board to assess an administrative fine in an amount not exceeding \$5,000 for the first violation of the healing arts act.


IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED that the license of Licensee be assessed a civil fine in the amount of \$500, payable within thirty days of the effective date of this order, for failure to have complied with the board written request for documentation.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that you shall submit proof that you have met your continuing education requirements for the previous year to the Board within fifteen days.

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that this is a summary order. A party to whom a summary order is issued may file a written request for a hearing within 15 days following service of the summary order. If a hearing is not requested, the summary order shall become effective as a final order of the Board upon expiration of the time for requesting a hearing. A request for a hearing must be addressed to Jack Confer, Executive Director, 235 South Topeka Boulevard, Topeka, Kansas 66603.
