**PROPOSED DEFAULT ORDER**

**NOW ON THIS** Sixteenth Day of October 2004, comes before the Board an application by Sabra Fisher, D.O. for a license to practice osteopathic medicine and surgery. Applicant does not appear. Kelli J. Benintendi, Associate Counsel, appears for the Board.

The Board finds that Applicant is in default by her non-appearance. The allegations stated in the Response in Opposition to Application for License are deemed undisputed. Based upon the undisputed facts, the Board finds, concludes, and orders as follows:

1. Applicant disclosed in her application for a license that she completed medical school in May 1993, a one-year internship in June 1994, and a three-year ophthalmology residency program in 1997. She then entered a family practice residency in September 1997, but left the program without completion in January 1998.
2. Applicant indicated in her application materials that she has not practiced medicine and surgery for several years, and that she does not believe she is professionally competent to practice at this time.
3. The Board concludes that it may deny an application to practice the healing arts upon a finding of professional incompetency, as provided by K.S.A. 65-

2836(b). That term is defined at K.S.A. 65-2837(a)(3) as including conduct demonstrating a manifest incapacity or incompetence to practice.

**IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED** that the application by Sabra Fisher for a license to practice osteopathic medicine and surgery is denied.

**PLEASE TAKE NOTICE** that this is proposed default order. A party may file a motion to vacate a proposed default order within seven days following service of the proposed order. Any such motion must be filed with the Executive Director at 235 S. Topeka Blvd., Topeka, KS 66603. A proposed default order becomes effective as a final agency order after the expiration of the time within which the party may file a written motion to vacate the proposed default order.
