JOURNAL ENTRY GRANTING MOTION TO TERMINATE CONSENT ORDER

On October 9, 2020, the parties appeared before the Kansas State Board of Healing Arts ("Board") for an electronic video Conference Hearing on Dr. Goodbinder's Motion to Terminate Consent Order in the above captioned matter. Matthew Gaus, Associate Litigation Counsel, appeared to present the position of the disciplinary panel of the Board. Jay M. Goodbinder, D.C., appeared by video conference and counsel for Dr. Goodbinder, Mark W. Stafford, appeared by video conference. Dr. Goodbinder and his counsel were in separate locations.

The Board, by its Acting Executive Director, Tucker L. Poling, a duly authorized representative of the Board, in accordance with the provisions of the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act, K.S.A. 77-501 *et seq.*, as amended, and upon due consideration of the agency record, the applicable statutes and regulations, the filings in this matter, and being otherwise duly advised in the premises, makes the following determinations:

1. On or about June 17, 2019, the Board and Dr. Goodbinder entered into a Consent Order addressing Dr. Goodbinder's actions including:

- (1) unprofessional or dishonorable conduct;
- (2) fraudulent or false advertisements;
- (3) willful and/or repeated violations of the Kansas Healing Arts act;
- (4) failure to maintain accurate patient records; and
- (5) references that may have indicated he was entitled to practice a branch of the healings arts for which he was not licensed.
- 2. The disciplinary action ordered by the Consent Order included:
 - (1) public censure;
 - (2) a fine of \$1,250.00;
 - (3) complete a Board approved recordkeeping/billing education course;
 - (4) complete Board approved continuing education courses with emphasis on proper advertising practices; and
 - (5) enter into and comply with all terms and conditions of a one-year remote billing and documentation monitoring contract. The monitoring agency shall select 20 random patient charts per month, review a minimum of 10 charts per month, and submit quarterly reports to the Board and Dr. Goodbinder.
- 3. The provisions of the Consent Order do not self-terminate. Dr. Goodbinder is permitted to request modification or termination of the provisions of the Consent Order after a period of one year. For any period of time Dr. Goodbinder is not in active practice of chiropractic in Kansas, the monitoring provisions will remain in effect but will be tolled and not count towards reducing the one-year timeframe.
- 4. On or about August 21, 2020, counsel for Dr. Goodbinder filed a Motion to Terminate Consent Order.
- 5. On October 9, 2020, the Board conducted a conference hearing on the Motion to Terminate Consent Order and determined that Dr. Goodbinder has satisfactorily met all the provisions of the June 17, 2019 Consent Order.

Therefore, Dr. Goodbinder's Motion to Terminate Consent Order is GRANTED.
