CONSENT ORDER

COMES NOW, the Kansas State Board of Healing Arts, (“Board”), by and through Seth K. Brackman, Associate Litigation Counsel (“Petitioner”), and Todd E. Hendrickson, D.C. (“Licensee”), *pro se*, and move the Board for approval of a Consent Order affecting Licensee’s license to practice chiropractic in the State of Kansas. The Parties stipulate and agree to the following:

1. Licensee’s last known mailing address to the Board is: **Confidential**
North Newton, Kansas 67117.
2. Licensee is or has been entitled to engage in the practice of chiropractic in the State of Kansas, having been issued License No. 01-04483 on approximately August 16, 1997. Licensee’s license is currently active, having last renewed his license on or about January 1, 2013.
3. The Board is the sole and exclusive administrative agency in the State of Kansas authorized to regulate the practice of the healing arts, specifically the practice of chiropractic. K.S.A. 65-2801 *et seq.* and K.S.A. 65-2871.
4. This Consent Order and the filing of such document are in accordance with applicable law and the Board has jurisdiction to enter into the Consent Order as provided by K.S.A. 77-505 and 65-2838. Upon approval, these stipulations shall

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constitute the findings of the Board, and this Consent Order shall constitute the Board's Final Order.

5. The Kansas Healing Arts Act is constitutional on its face and as applied in this case. Licensee agrees that, in considering this matter, the Board is not acting beyond its jurisdiction as provided by law.
6. Licensee voluntarily and knowingly waives his right to a hearing. Licensee voluntarily and knowingly waives his right to present a defense by oral testimony and documentary evidence, to submit rebuttal evidence, and to conduct cross-examination of witnesses. Licensee voluntarily and knowingly agrees to waive all possible substantive and procedural motions and defenses that could be raised if an administrative hearing were held.
7. The terms and conditions of the Consent Order are entered into between the undersigned parties and are submitted for the purpose of allowing these terms and conditions to become an Order of the Board. This Consent Order shall not be binding on the Board until an authorized signature is affixed at the end of this document. Licensee specifically acknowledges that counsel for the Board is not authorized to sign this Consent Order on behalf of the Board.
8. The Board has received information and investigated the same, and has reason to believe that there may be grounds pursuant to K.S.A.65-2836, to take action with respect to Licensee's license under the Kansas Healing Arts Act, K.S.A. 65-2801, *et seq.* based upon two separate complaints filed with the Board.
9. On or about September 29, 2010, the Board received the first complaint from a former patient ("Patient 1") of the Licensee.

10. Patient 1 alleged that Licensee engaged in a sexual relationship with her from February 2006 to May 2006 while she was Licensee's patient.
11. On or about October 18, 2010, Licensee acknowledged that his relationship with Patient 1 had extended beyond that of a doctor/patient relationship and that he had engaged in a sexual relationship with her while she was his actual patient.
12. On or about June 23, 2011, the Board received the second complaint from an anonymous complainant alleging that Patient 2 was billed for adjustments on a day in which Patient 2 was in surgery.
13. Licensee's documentation in regard to Patient 2 is significantly lacking in that Licensee:
 - a. Seldom documents pertinent information;
 - b. Seldom documents the treatment actually performed;
 - c. Lists the same short-term diagnosis over a five (5) year period;
 - d. Is repetitive without differentiation between individual patient visits.
14. Licensee acknowledges that, if formal hearing proceedings were conducted and Licensee presented no exhibits, witnesses, or other evidence, the Board has sufficient evidence to prove that Licensee has violated the Kansas Healing Arts Act with respect to the above allegations. Licensee further waives his right to dispute or otherwise contest the allegations contained in the above paragraphs in any further proceeding before this Board.

15. Licensee's acts, if proven, constitute unprofessional conduct as set forth in K.S.A. 65-2836, as further defined by:
- a. K.S.A. 65-2836(b) as further defined by K.S.A. 65-2837(b)(16) for the “[c]ommission of any act of sexual abuse, misconduct or other improper sexual contact, which exploits the licensee-patient relationship, with a patient or a person responsible for health care decisions concerning such patient.”
 - b. K.S.A. 65-2836(b) as further defined by K.S.A. 65-2837(b)(25) for “[failing] to keep written medical records which accurately describe the services rendered to the patient, including patient histories, pertinent findings, examination results and test results.”
 - c. K.S.A. 65-2836(k) for violating any lawful rule and regulation promulgated by the Board as defined in K.A.R. 100-24-1.
16. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-2836, the Board may revoke, suspend, limit, censure or place under probationary conditions Licensee's license and pursuant to K.S.A. 65-2863a the Board has the authority to impose administrative fines for violations of the Kansas Healing Arts Act.
17. According to K.S.A. 65-2838(b) and K.S.A. 77-505, the Board has authority to enter into this Consent Order without the necessity of proceeding to a formal hearing.
18. All pending investigation materials in KSBHA Investigation Numbers 11-00168 and 12-00020 in regard to Licensee were fully reviewed and considered by the Board members who serve on the Board's Disciplinary Panel No. 26 and No. 27.

Disciplinary Panel No. 26 and No. 27 authorized and directed Board counsel to seek settlement of this matter with the provisions contained in this Consent Order.

19. Licensee further understands and agrees that if the Board finds, after due written notice and an opportunity for a hearing, that Licensee has failed to comply with any of the terms of this Consent Order, the Board may immediately impose any sanction provided for by law, including but not limited to suspension or revocation of Licensee's license to practice chiropractic in the State of Kansas. Licensee hereby expressly understands and agrees that, at any such hearing, the sole issue shall be whether or not Licensee has failed to comply with any of the terms or conditions set forth in this Consent Order. The Board acknowledges that at any such hearing, Licensee retains the right to confront and examine all witnesses, present evidence, testify on his own behalf, contest the allegations, present oral argument, appeal to the courts, and all other rights set forth in the Kansas Administrative Procedures Act, K.S.A. 77-501 *et seq.*, and the Kansas Healing Arts Act, K.S.A. 65-2801 *et seq.*
20. Nothing in this Consent Order shall be construed to deny the Board jurisdiction to investigate alleged violations of the Kansas Healing Arts Act, or to investigate complaints received under the Risk Management Law, K.S.A. 65-4921 *et seq.*, that are known or unknown and are not covered under this Consent Order, or to initiate formal proceedings based upon known or unknown allegations of violations of the Kansas Healing Arts Act.
21. Licensee hereby releases the Board, its individual members (in their official and personal capacity), attorneys, employees and agents, hereinafter collectively

referred to as “Releasees”, from any and all claims, including but not limited to those alleged damages, actions, liabilities, both administrative and civil, including the Kansas Judicial Review Act, K.S.A. 77-601 *et seq.* arising out of the investigation and acts leading to the execution of this Consent Order. This release shall forever discharge the Releasees of any and all claims or demands of every kind and nature that Licensee has claimed to have had at the time of this release or might have had, either known or unknown, suspected or unsuspected, and Licensee shall not commence to prosecute, cause or permit to be prosecuted, any action or proceeding of any description against the Releasees.

22. Licensee further understands and agrees that upon signature by Licensee, this document shall be deemed a public record and shall be reported to any entities authorized to receive disclosure of the Consent Order.
23. This Consent Order, when signed by both parties, constitutes the entire agreement between the parties and may only be modified or amended by a subsequent document executed in the same manner by the parties.
24. Licensee agrees that all information maintained by the Board pertaining to the nature and result of any complaint and/or investigation may be fully disclosed to and considered by the Board in conjunction with the presentation of any offer of settlement, even if Licensee is not present. Licensee further acknowledges that the Board may conduct further inquiry as it deems necessary before the complete or partial acceptance or rejection of any offer of settlement.
25. Licensee, by signature to this document, waives any objection to the participation of the Board members, including the Disciplinary Panel and General Counsel, in

the consideration of this offer of settlement and agrees not to seek the disqualification or recusal of any Board member or General Counsel in any future proceedings on the basis that the Board member or General Counsel has received investigative information from any source which otherwise may not be admissible or admitted as evidence.

26. Licensee acknowledges that he has read this Consent Order and fully understands the contents.
27. Licensee acknowledges that this Consent Order has been entered into freely and voluntarily.
28. All correspondence or communication between Licensee and the Board relating to the Consent Order shall be by certified mail addressed to:

29. Licensee shall obey all federal, state and local laws and rules governing the practice of chiropractic in the State of Kansas that may be in place at the time of execution of the Consent Order or may become effective subsequent to the execution of this document.
30. Upon execution of this Consent Order by affixing a Board authorized signature below, the provisions of this Consent Order shall become an Order under K.S.A. 65-2838. This Consent Order shall constitute the Board's Order when filed with the office of the Executive Director for the Board and no further Order is required.

31. This Consent Order constitutes disciplinary action.
32. The Board may consider all aspects of this Consent Order in any future matter regarding Licensee.
33. In lieu of conducting a formal proceeding, Licensee, by signature affixed to this Consent Order, hereby voluntarily agrees to the following disciplinary action against his license to engage in the practice of chiropractic:

CENSURE

34. Licensee is publicly censured for violating the Kansas Healing Arts Act.

FINE

35. Licensee agrees to pay a FINE in the amount of One Thousand Dollars and Zero Cents (\$1,000.00).
36. Such fine shall be paid to the “Kansas State Board of Healing Arts” in full on or before November 30, 2013.
37. All monetary payments made to the Board relating to this Consent Order shall be mailed to the Board by certified mail addressed to:

EDUCATION

38. Licensee shall successfully complete ten (10) hours of additional continuing medical education credits specifically in the area of “Medical Record Keeping”. Such additional hours shall be at Licensee’s own expense.

39. Licensee shall provide the course completion certificates to the Compliance Coordinator, at the address provided above, no later than November 30, 2013.
40. These hours shall be in addition to those hours required for renewal of licensure.

MONITORING

41. Within ten (10) days of the approval of the Consent Order, Licensee shall enter into and comply with all terms and conditions of a monitoring contract with Affiliated Monitors, Inc. (“AMI”) of Boston, Massachusetts, and agrees to follow all recommendations by AMI.
42. Licensee further agrees to immediately notify the Board of any revisions to the contract and to immediately provide a copy of such revised contract to the Board.
43. The provisions of said contract are incorporated herein as if fully restated.
44. Licensee shall sign a contract with AMI for monitoring for no less than one (1) year and provide a copy of the contract to the Board no later than November 30, 2013.
45. The Monitor shall conduct his first review within thirty (30) days of the Board’s approval of the Consent Order.
46. Monitoring shall include:
- a. Monthly site visits for the term of the Consent Order;
 - b. Review of patient charts and billing with a minimum of ten (10) patient charts for each monitoring visit. Monitor(s) will randomly select charts based on patients seen by Licensee;
 - c. Monitor(s) shall submit a written report of the results of each review to the Board on a quarterly basis as described below. The report shall identify

any deficiencies in Licensee's practices, which in the professional judgment of the Monitor(s) reasonably warrants corrective action by Licensee. The Monitor(s) shall provide a copy of each report to Licensee and the Board;

- d. Monitoring reports shall be due quarterly to the Board. The first monitoring report shall be submitted no later than February 15, 2014, for the monitoring period of November 2013, December 2013, and January 2014. All subsequent monitoring reports shall be due on the 15th day of May, August, November, and February until the monitoring is terminated by the Board;
- e. Licensee is responsible for ensuring AMI's timely submission of reports to the Board;
- f. Licensee shall take any and all corrective actions which are reasonably necessary to correct any and all deficiencies identified in any of the practice reviews conducted by the Monitor.

47. Licensee expressly agrees that he shall be responsible for all costs and expenses associated with the Practice Monitoring by AMI and that the Board shall bear no responsibility or liability for the costs of those services.

48. All reports required pursuant to this Consent Order shall be submitted to:

TIMEFRAME

49. The above monitoring provisions are not self-terminating. After a period of one (1) year, Licensee may request modification or termination of the provisions. For any period of time that Licensee is not actively practicing chiropractic in Kansas, the monitoring provisions will remain in effect but will be tolled and not counted toward reducing the one (1) year timeframe.


IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the Consent Order and agreement of the parties contained herein is adopted by the Board as findings of fact, conclusions of law, and as a Final Order of the Board.

IT IS SO ORDERED on this 16 day of Oct, 2013.


