FINAL ORDER DENYING LICENSURE BY ENDORSEMENT

NOW on this 22nd day of June 2012, comes before the Kansas State Board of Healing Arts (“Board”) the application of Marie Laure Jean-Jacques, M.D. (“Applicant”) for licensure by endorsement to practice medicine and surgery in the State of Kansas. Applicant appears in person and pro se. Jessica A. Byrson, Associate Litigation Counsel, appears on behalf of the Board.

Pursuant to the authority granted to the Board by the Kansas Healing Arts Act, K.S.A. 65-2801, *et seq.*, and in accordance with the provisions of the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act K.S.A. 77-501, *et seq.*, the Board hereby enters this Final Order in the above-captioned matter. After reviewing the file, hearing the statements and arguments of the parties, and being otherwise duly advised in the premises, the Board makes the following findings, conclusions and order:

1. On or about March 8, 2012, Marie Laure Jean-Jacques, M.D. (“Applicant”) submitted an application for licensure by endorsement to practice medicine and surgery in the State of Kansas. Such application was deemed complete and filed with the Board on or about May 24, 2012.

2. On or about October 31, 1997, applicant received a Medico Cirujano y Partero degree from Benemerita Universidad Autonoma De Puebla located in Puebla, Mexico.

3. Benemerita Universidad Autonoma De Puebla is not a school which has been approved by the Board. It has not been disapproved by the Board either.

4. Applicant successfully completed a three (3) year, Family Medicine Residency program at SUNY Health Science Center – Brooklyn in Brooklyn, New York, between July 2006 and June 2009, which is accredited by the Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education (ACGME).

5. Applicant successfully completed the Education Commission for Foreign Medical Graduates (ECFMG) in January 2005.

6. Applicant presently holds a license to practice medicine and surgery in the State of Pennsylvania, having been issued such license on February 2012, although there is no evidence that Applicant has actively practiced medicine in Pennsylvania.

7. Applicant had an Institutional License to practice medicine and surgery in the State of Kansas, License No. 08-00319, which Applicant held from July 27, 2010 to May 5, 2012, while she was employed at Larned State Hospital.

8. K.S.A. 65-2833 states:

The board, without examination, may issue a license to a person who has been in the active practice of a branch of the healing arts in some other state, territory, the District of Columbia or other country upon certificate of the proper licensing authority of that state, territory, District of Columbia or other country certifying that the applicant is duly licensed, that the applicant's license has never been limited, suspended or revoked, that the licensee has never been censured or had other disciplinary action taken and that, so far as the records of such authority are concerned, the applicant is entitled to its endorsement. The applicant shall also present proof satisfactory to the board:

(a) That the state, territory, District of Columbia or country in which the applicant last practiced has and maintains standards at least equal to those maintained by Kansas.

(b) That the applicant's original license was based upon an examination at least equal in quality to the examination required in this state and that the passing grade required to obtain such original license was comparable to that required in this state.

(c) Of the date of the applicant's original and any and all endorsed licenses and the date and place from which any license was attained.

(d) That the applicant has been actively engaged in practice under such license or licenses since issued, and if not, fix the time when and reason why the applicant was out of practice.

(e) That the applicant has a reasonable ability to communicate in English.

An applicant for endorsement registration shall not be licensed unless the applicant's individual qualifications meet the Kansas legal requirements.

In lieu of any other requirement prescribed by law for satisfactory passage of any examination in any branch of the healing arts the board may accept evidence satisfactory to it that the applicant or licensee has satisfactorily passed an equivalent examination given by a national board of examiners in chiropractic, osteopathic medicine and surgery or medicine and surgery as now required by Kansas statutes for endorsement from other states.


9. Since becoming licensed in Pennsylvania, Applicant has practiced medicine in a locum tenens capacity for Indian Health Services in North Dakota for the past month.

10. The Board finds that Applicant has not engaged in sufficient active practice under her Pennsylvania license to warrant licensure by endorsement in Kansas.

11. The Board concludes that Applicant has not satisfactorily fulfilled K.S.A. 65-2833 to be granted a license by endorsement to practice medicine and surgery in the State of Kansas.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED, BY THE KANSAS STATE BOARD OF HEALING ARTS that Applicant's application for a license by endorsement to practice medicine and surgery in the State of Kansas is hereby DENIED.

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that this is a Final Order. A Final Order is effective upon service, and service of a Final Order is complete upon mailing. Pursuant to K.S.A. 77-529, Licensee may petition the Board for Reconsideration of a Final Order within fifteen (15) days following service of the final order. Additionally, a party to an agency proceeding may seek judicial review of a Final Order by filing a petition in the District Court, as authorized by K.S.A. 77-601, *et seq.* Reconsideration of a Final Order is not a prerequisite to judicial review. A petition for judicial review is not timely unless filed within **30 days** following service of the Final Order.
