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CONSENT ORDER

COMES NOW, the Kansas State Board of Healing Arts, (“Board”), by and through Stacy R. Bond, Associate Litigation Counsel (“Petitioner”), and William King Kelly, M.D. (“Applicant”), *pro se*, and move the Board for approval of a Consent Order affecting Applicant’s license to practice medicine and surgery in the State of Kansas.

The Parties stipulate and agree to the following:

1. Applicant’s last known mailing address to the Board is: (confidential)

2. On or about September 14, 2009, Applicant submitted to the Board an application for licensure in medicine and surgery. Such application was deemed complete on January 15, 2010.
3. The Board is the sole and exclusive administrative agency in the State of Kansas authorized to regulate the practice of the healing arts, specifically the practice of medicine and surgery. K.S.A. 65-2801 et seq. and K.S.A. 65-2869.
4. This Consent Order and the filing of such document are in accordance with applicable law and the Board has jurisdiction to enter into the Consent Order as provided by K.S.A. 77-505 and 65-2838. Upon approval, these stipulations shall

constitute the findings of the Board, and this Consent Order shall constitute the Board's Final Order.

5. The Kansas Healing Arts Act is constitutional on its face and as applied in the case. Applicant agrees that, in considering this matter, the Board is not acting beyond its jurisdiction as provided by law.
6. Applicant voluntarily and knowingly waives his right to a hearing. Applicant voluntarily and knowingly waives his right to present a defense by oral testimony and documentary evidence, to submit rebuttal evidence, and to conduct cross-examination of witnesses. Applicant voluntarily and knowingly agrees to waive all possible substantive and procedural motions and defenses that could be raised if an administrative hearing were held.
7. The terms and conditions of the Consent Order are entered into between the undersigned parties and are submitted for the purpose of allowing these terms and conditions to become an Order of the Board. This Consent Order shall not be binding on the Board until an authorized signature is affixed at the end of this document. Applicant specifically acknowledges that counsel for the Board is not authorized to sign this Consent Order on behalf of the Board.
8. The Board has received information and investigated the same, and has reason to believe that there may be grounds pursuant to K.S.A. 65-2836 (Confidential) to take action with respect to Applicant's license under the Healing Arts Act, K.S.A. 65-2801, *et seq.*
9. On January 23, 2002, the Maryland Board of Physicians filed a Summary/Emergency Suspension of Medical License against Applicant's license.

10. During the suspension of Applicant's license, his personal life continued to spiral downward. Applicant wrote prescriptions for scheduled drugs in the name of a deceased patient and then picked them up from the pharmacy. Applicant plead guilty to obtaining a controlled/dangerous substance by fraud in August 2002 and was placed on probation for one year.
11. On October 22, 2003, the Maryland Board revoked Applicant's Maryland license.
12. On February 13, 2003, Applicant was arrested for possession of cocaine and heroine. Applicant plead guilty to possession of cocaine and was sentenced to two years probation. Applicant was able to successfully complete this probation period on September 22, 2006.
13. On December 6, 2006, Applicant applied for reinstatement with the Maryland Board. On May 18, 2008, the Maryland Board granted Applicant's request with the condition that he be placed on probation for five (5) years and (confidential)

and had taken the SPEX examination in

January 2008 and had passed.

14. Applicant acknowledges that if formal hearing proceedings were conducted and Applicant presented no exhibits, witnesses or other evidence, the Board has sufficient evidence to prove that Applicant has violated the Healing Arts Act with respect to the above allegations. Applicant further waives his right to dispute or otherwise contest the allegations contained in the above paragraphs in any further proceeding before this Board.
15. A protective order is hereby entered to protect all confidential information under (confidential) and K.S.A. 65-2836( (confidential)
16. Applicant violated K.S.A. 65-2836(c), in that Applicant has been convicted of a felony, whether or not related to the practice of the healing arts. In the case of a person who has been convicted of a felony and who applies for an original license, the application for a license shall be denied unless a 2/3 majority of the board members present and voting on such application determine by clear and convincing evidence that such person will not pose a threat to the public in such person's capacity as a licensee and that such person has been sufficiently rehabilitated to warrant the public trust.
17. Applicant violated K.S.A. 65-2836(j) by having had a license to practice the healing arts revoked, suspended or limited by the proper licensing authority of another state.

18. Applicant has violated K.S.A. 65-2836(p), in that Applicant has prescribed, sold, administered, distributed or given a controlled substances to any person for other than medically accepted or lawful purposes.
19. Pursuant to K.S.A. 65-2836, as amended by HB 2620 on July 1, 2008, the Board may revoke, suspend, limit, censure or place under probationary conditions Applicant's license and pursuant to K.S.A. 65-2863a the Board has the authority to impose administrative fines for violations of the Healing Arts Act.
20. According to K.S.A.65-2838(b), the Board has authority to enter into this Consent Order without the necessity of proceeding to a formal hearing.
21. All pending investigation materials regarding Applicant were fully reviewed and considered by the Board member(s) who serve on the Board's Disciplinary Panel. Disciplinary Panel No. 24 authorized and directed Board counsel to seek settlement of this matter with the provisions contained in this Consent Order.
22. In lieu of conducting a formal proceeding, Applicant, by signature affixed to this Consent Order, hereby voluntarily agrees to the following as a condition to being granted licensure to engage in the practice of medicine and surgery:

- h. Applicant agrees to immediately notify a Board representative and MAP if he experiences a relapse or fails to comply in any manner with his monitoring contract.
- i. Applicant will furnish a copy of this Consent Order to each and every state in which he holds licensure or applies for licensure and to an appropriate work site supervisor or personnel (confidential)
- j. Applicant shall immediately notify the Board or its designee of any citation, arrest or charge filed against him or of any conviction for traffic or criminal offenses.
- k. Applicant shall at all times keep Board staff informed of all his current practice locations, addresses and telephone numbers. Applicant shall provide the above information in writing to the Board within ten (10) days of any such change.

**PROBATION AND LIMITATION TIMEFRAME**

- l. The above monitoring provisions and limitations are not self-terminating. After a period of five (5) years, Applicant may request modification or termination of the provisions. For any period of time that Applicant is not actively practicing medicine and surgery in Kansas, the monitoring

provisions and limitations will remain in effect but will be tolled and not counted towards reducing the five (5) year timeframe.

23. Applicant's failure to comply with the provisions of the Consent Order may result in the Board taking further disciplinary action as the Board deems appropriate according to the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act and Kansas Healing Arts Act.
24. Nothing in this Consent Order shall be construed to deny the Board jurisdiction to investigate alleged violations of the Healing Arts Act, or to investigate complaints received under the Risk Management Law, K.S.A. 64-4921 et seq., that are known or unknown and are not covered under this Consent Order, or to initiate formal proceedings based upon known or unknown allegations of violations of the Healing Arts Act.
25. Applicant hereby releases the Board, its individual members (in their official and personal capacity), attorneys, employees and agents, hereinafter collectively referred to as "Releasees", from any and all claims, including but not limited to those alleged damages, actions, liabilities, both administrative and civil, including the Kansas Act for Judicial Review and Civil Enforcement of Agency Actions, K.S.A. 77-601 et seq. arising out of the investigation and acts leading to the execution of this Consent Order. This release shall forever discharge the Releasees of any and all claims or demands of every kind and nature that Applicant has claimed to have had at the time of this release or might have had, either known or unknown, suspected or unsuspected, and Applicant shall not

- commence to prosecute, cause or permit to be prosecuted, any action or proceeding of any description against the Releasees.
26. Applicant further understands and agrees that upon signature by Applicant, this document shall be deemed a public record and shall be reported to any reporting entities authorized to receive disclosure of the Consent Order.
27. This Consent Order, when signed by both parties, constitutes the entire agreement between the parties and may only be modified or amended by a subsequent document executed in the same manner by the parties.
28. Applicant agrees that all information maintained by the Board pertaining to the nature and result of any complaint and/or investigation may be fully disclosed to and considered by the Board in conjunction with the presentation of any offer of settlement, even if Applicant is not present. Applicant further acknowledges that the Board may conduct further inquiry as it deems necessary before the complete or partial acceptance or rejection of any offer of settlement.
29. Applicant, by signature to this document, waives any objection to the participation of the Board members, including the Disciplinary Panel and General Counsel, in the consideration of this offer of settlement and agrees not to seek the disqualification or recusal of any Board member or General Counsel in any future proceedings on the basis that the Board member or General Counsel has received investigative information from any source which otherwise may not be admissible or admitted as evidence.
30. Applicant acknowledges that he has read this Consent Order and fully understands the contents.

31. Applicant acknowledges that this Consent Order has been entered into freely and voluntarily.
32. All correspondence or communication between Applicant and the Board relating to the Consent Order shall be by certified mail addressed to the Kansas State Board of Healing Arts, Attn: Compliance Coordinator, 235 S. Topeka Blvd., Topeka, Kansas 66603-3068.
33. Applicant shall obey all federal, state and local laws and rules governing the practice of medicine and surgery in the State of Kansas that may be in place at the time of execution of the Consent Order or may become effective subsequent to the execution of this document.
34. Upon execution of this Consent Order by affixing a Board authorized signature below, the provisions of this Consent Order shall become an Order under K.S.A. 65-2838. This Consent Order shall constitute the Board's Order when filed with the office of the Executive Director for the Board and no further Order is required.
35. This Consent Order constitutes disciplinary action.
36. The Board may consider all aspects of this Consent Order in any future matter regarding Applicant.

**IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED** that the Consent Order and agreement of the parties contained herein is adopted by the Board as findings of fact and conclusions of law.

**IT IS FURTHER ORDERED** that upon meeting all technical requirements for licensure, Applicant shall be granted a license.

**IT IS FURTHER ORDERED** that:






