**FINAL ORDER GRANTING LICENSURE BY ENDORSEMENT**

NOW on this 19<sup>th</sup> day of October 2012, comes before the Kansas State Board of Healing Arts (“Board”) the application of T. Kevin King, M.D. (“Applicant”) for licensure by endorsement to practice medicine and surgery in the State of Kansas. Applicant appears in person and *pro se*. Reese Hays, Litigation Counsel, appears on behalf of the Respondent Board.

Pursuant to the authority granted to the Board by the Kansas Healing Arts Act, K.S.A. 65-2801, *et seq.*, and in accordance with the provisions of the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act K.S.A. 77-501, *et seq.*, the Board hereby enters this Final Order in the above-captioned matter. After reviewing the agency record, hearing the statements and arguments of the parties, and being otherwise duly advised in the premises, the Board makes the following findings, conclusions and order:

1. On or about July 3, 2012, Applicant submitted an application for licensure by endorsement to practice medicine and surgery in the State of Kansas. Such application was deemed complete and filed with the Board on or about September 24, 2012.

2. In June of 1970, Applicant graduated from Baylor College of Medicine in Houston, Texas, and has been unable to obtain official verification of his medical school education directly from the school to submit with his application because they were destroyed in a flood due to Tropical Storm Allison in 2001.

3. Applicant completed an Accreditation Council for Graduate Medical Education (ACGME) accredited postgraduate training program with The Methodist Hospital in Houston, Texas in June 1971. Applicant then completed a one year ACGME accredited residency program at Parkland Health & Hospital System in Dallas, Texas in July 1974. Applicant also completed a two year ACGME accredited residency program at Parkland Memorial Hospital in Dallas, Texas in June 1982.

4. Applicant is currently licensed to practice medicine in the State of Texas, having been licensed on August 15, 1970. There are no reported disciplinary actions against Applicant's ~~California~~ <sup>Texas</sup> license.

5. Applicant is also currently licensed to practice medicine in the State of Washington, having been licensed on May 7, 1973. There are no reported disciplinary actions against Applicant's ~~Massachusetts~~ <sup>Washington</sup> license.


6. Finally, Applicant is also currently licensed to practice medicine in the State of Missouri, having been licensed on May 9, 1980. There are no reported disciplinary actions against Applicant's ~~Massachusetts~~ <sup>Missouri</sup> license.

7. The Board finds that Applicant has provided satisfactory proof of his medical school education by virtue of his licensure in other states.

8. The Board finds that Applicant has demonstrated satisfactory fulfillment of K.S.A. 65-2833 to be granted a license by endorsement to practice medicine and surgery in the State of Kansas.

**IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED, BY THE KANSAS STATE BOARD OF HEALING ARTS** that Applicant is hereby granted a license by endorsement to practice medicine and surgery in the State of Kansas.


