FINAL ORDER FOLLOWING CONFERENCE HEARING

NOW on this 17th day of August 2002, comes on for conference hearing before the Kansas State Board of Healing Arts ("Board") the request of David L. Liska, D.C. ("Applicant") for waiver of passage of the examinations required by the Board for a license to practice chiropractic in the state of Kansas.

Charlene K. Abbott, Licensing Administrator, presented information before the Board. Applicant appeared in person *pro se*.

After reviewing the file, hearing the statements and being otherwise duly advised in the premises, the Board finds as follows:

1. On April 26, 2002, Applicant filed an Application for Licensure to receive a license to practice chiropractic in the state of Kansas.
2. As part of his Application, Applicant provided evidence that he had graduated from an accredited college of chiropractic on September 20, 1985.
3. For graduates from an accredited college of chiropractic in 1985, the Board has approved Parts I and II and the physiotherapy examinations administered by the National Board of Chiropractic Examiners in order to be eligible for licensure under K.S.A. 65-2873.

4. Applicant has not passed Part II or the physiotherapy examinations administered by the National Board of Chiropractic Examiners and, therefore, is not eligible for licensure by examination under K.S.A. 65-2873.

5. As part of the Application, Applicant provided evidence that he was licensed to practice chiropractic in the state of California on July 18, 1986, and that he has been in the active practice of chiropractic in the state of California since that date and has never had any disciplinary action taken against him.

6. Applicant has provided proof passage of the examinations required by California for licensure, including physiotherapy.

7. The California examination, upon which his license in that state was based, was at least equal in quality to the examinations required by the state of Kansas and that the passing grade required to obtain his California license was comparable to that required by Kansas.


8. Applicant meets all of the requirements set forth in K.S.A. 65-2833 and is eligible for a license by endorsement under the provisions of that statute.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the above findings are made the order of the Board; that Applicant's request for waiver of examinations is granted; and that Applicant is eligible for a license to practice chiropractic in the state of Kansas under K.S.A. 65-2833.

IT IS SO ORDERED.




