FINAL ORDER FOLLOWING CONFERENCE HEARING

NOW on this 13th day of August, 1994, this matter comes on for consideration before the Kansas State Board of Healing Arts ("Board") sitting as a whole as Presiding Officer in a conference proceeding pursuant to the provisions of K.S.A. 77-533 through 77-535, the application of Walter K. Long, M.D. ("Applicant") for licensure by endorsement. Gretchen E. Schmidt, Associate Counsel, appears for and on behalf of the Board. Applicant does not appear.

After reviewing the application and being otherwise duly advised in the premises, the Board finds as follows:

1. On April 8, 1993, Applicant applied for licensure by endorsement. Said application for licensure by endorsement was deemed complete on June 20, 1994.

2. Based upon information provided by Applicant in his application for licensure, the Board conducted an investigation into Applicant's affirmative answers to questions posed in section VIII of the application, namely the suspension of privileges from two medical care facilities in the State of Texas, notification of charges or complaints by another state licensing agency, and limited disciplinary action imposed by the Texas State Board of Medical Examiners.

3. Upon review of the investigative material generated by Board staff, the Board

finds no cause exists to deny Applicant's application for licensure by endorsement or limit a permanent license to practice medicine and surgery under K.S.A. 65-2836.

IT IS THEREFORE BY THE BOARD ORDERED as follows:

A. That the findings herein above made be in the same are made the Order of the Board.


B. Applicant's application should be placed on the Board agenda for final approval and issuance of a permanent license at the next regularly scheduled meeting of the Board; in the interim, a temporary permit should be forthwith issued to Applicant under K.S.A. 65-2811(a)(1) which will authorize practice in the state until the permanent license is issued.

C. This is a Final Order and is effective upon service upon the parties. Any party may, within 15 days after service, file a Petition for Reconsideration. The filing of a Petition for Reconsideration is not a prerequisite for seeking administrative or judicial review.
