**FINAL ORDER FOLLOWING CONFERENCE HEARING**

NOW on this 12th day of August, 1995, comes on for consideration before the Kansas State Board of Healing Arts (hereafter "Board") sitting as a whole as Presiding Officer in a conference proceeding pursuant to the provisions of K.S.A. 77-533 through 77-535, the application of Nikolaos Makridakis, D.P.M. ("Applicant") for licensure to practice podiatric medicine in the State of Kansas. Lori R. Miskel, Associate Counsel, appears for and on behalf of the board. Applicant appears not.

After reviewing the application and being otherwise duly advised in the premises, the Board finds as follows:

**FINDINGS OF FACT**

1. Applicant has not received a permanent license in any state.
2. Applicant applied for licensure in Kansas in September, 1993.
3. Applicant took the PMLexis on June 14, 1994.
4. Applicant failed the PMLexis.
5. Applicant was convicted in Indiana on May 3, 1995, of one count of

practicing medicine without a license, a class C felony, one count of fraud, a class D felony, and one count of theft, a class D felony.

### CONCLUSIONS OF LAW

1. Applicant failed to attain an average grade of 75 percent on the PMLexis, as required by K.S.A. 65-2004 and K.A.R. 100-7-1(6).

2. Applicant has been convicted of a felony, whether or not related to the practice of the healing arts, in violation of K.S.A. 65-2836(c).

3. The above noted facts and conclusions constitute grounds for which the board may deny an application for licensure to practice podiatric medicine in the state of Kansas.

**IT IS THEREFORE BY THE BOARD ORDERED** as follows:

A. That the findings herein above made be and the same are made the Order of the Board.


B. Adequate information has been provided to the board to justify denial of a permanent license to applicant to practice podiatric medicine in the state of Kansas. Applicant's application for licensure is therefore DENIED.

C. This is a Final Order and is effective upon service upon the parties. Any party may, within 15 days after service, file a petition for reconsideration. The filing of a petition for reconsideration is not a prerequisite for seeking administrative or judicial review.

IT IS SO ORDERED.


