KANSAS STATE BOARD OF HEALING ARTS
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SUMMARY ORDER OF CANCELLATION OF LICENSE

NOW, on this 26th day of August, 1992, this matter comes before Lawrence T. Buening, Jr., serving as Presiding Officer in summary proceedings. Licensee does not appear.

The Presiding Officer specifies the following findings of fact, conclusions of law and reasons for actions:

1. Licensee's license issued by the Kansas State Board of Healing Arts (hereafter "Board") to practice in the state of Kansas expired June 30, 1992 pursuant to K.S.A. 1991 Supp. 65-2809(a).
2. On or about July 10, 1992, the Board gave Licensee a second notice that the license had expired and provided a Notice of Proposed Cancellation of License that if a fully completed application for renewal, the annual renewal fee of \$150 and additional late fee of \$50 was not received by July 31, 1992, a Conference Hearing would be held August 3, 1992 at 11:00 a.m. to consider the cancellation of the license.

3. On or about July 20, 1992, the Board received Licensee's application for renewal and a check numbered #1049 drawn on the Commerce Bank and Trust of Topeka in the sum of \$200.

4. As a result of receipt of said check and application for renewal, Licensee was issued receipt #9381968 indicating Licensee's license to practice in the state of Kansas had been renewed for the period July 1, 1992 through June 30, 1993.

5. On August 3, 1992 the Board received notification from the State Treasurer that Licensee's aforementioned check had been "returned not paid" because of insufficient funds in the account and Licensee was advised of the return of the check but has failed to pay the annual fee of \$150 together with the additional fee of \$50.

6. Licensee's license to practice chiropractic in the state of Kansas should be cancelled due to failure to renew as provided by K.S.A. 1991 Supp. 65-2809.


IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the license of Licensee issued by the Board to practice chiropractic in the state of Kansas is cancelled.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Licensee is entitled to request a hearing on this Order, in writing, to the Kansas State Board of Healing Arts, 235 S. Topeka Blvd., Topeka, Kansas 66603-3068 within 15 days of service of this Order and if a hearing is

not requested within the time and manner stated above, this decision becomes final and effective upon the expiration of the time for requesting a hearing.
