FINAL ORDER TERMINATING PROBATION ON LICENSE

NOW, on this 19th day of October, 2012, comes before the Kansas State Board of Healing Arts (“Board”) the request of Robert J. Neu, D.C. (“Licensee”), for termination of probation imposed on his license pursuant to the terms of a Consent Order entered with the Board in 2008. Licensee appears in person and *pro se*. Reese H. Hays, Litigation Counsel, appears on behalf of the Respondent Board.

Pursuant to the authority granted to the Board by the Kansas Healing Arts Act, K.S.A. 65-2801, *et seq.*, and in accordance with the provisions of the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act, K.S.A. 77-501, *et seq.*, the Board hereby enters this Final Order following a conference hearing in the above-captioned matter. After reviewing the agency record, hearing the testimony and arguments of the parties, and being otherwise duly advised in the premises, the Board makes the following findings, conclusions of law and order:

1. Licensee is licensed to engage in the practice of chiropractic in the State of Kansas, having been issued License No. 01-05223 on approximately October 14, 2008.

2. As a condition to being granted licensure in Kansas, Licensee entered into a Consent Order with the Board in which he agreed to such license being placed on probation with requirements that includes **Confidential**

for a period of five (5) years. Under the terms of the Consent Order, Licensee is also required **Confidential**

3. The probation requirements of the Consent Order are self-terminating. The Consent Order provides that Licensee may for good cause move the Board for termination.

4. The five (5) year timeframe for Licensee's probation has not yet passed.

5. To date, Licensee has remained compliant with all of the Consent Order's requirements. The Board has received **Confidential** which indicate full compliance.

6. On or about September 14, 2012, Licensee filed a request with the Board to terminate the probation of his license.

7. On September 19, 2012, the Respondent Board filed a Response to Licensee's request.

8. At the conference hearing, additional evidence supporting Licensee's request to terminate the probation was submitted. **Confidential**

Confidential and that there seemed to be no clinical justification for continued monitoring.

9. The Board finds that Licensee has shown good cause to terminate the probation imposed on his license by the October 14, 2008 Consent Order.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED, BY THE KANSAS STATE BOARD OF HEALING ARTS, that Licensee has satisfied all terms and conditions of the requirements in the Consent Order, and that Licensee's Request for Termination of Probation imposed by the Consent Order is hereby granted.


