FINAL ORDER

NOW ON THIS 15th day of October, 2009, the above-entitled matter comes on before

John (Jack) Confer, Executive Director of the Kansas State Board of Healing Arts. After reviewing the file and being duly advised in the premises, the Executive Director makes the following determinations.

1. On September 10, 2009, the Executive Director issued a Summary Order regarding the license of Corrie C. Nevil, M.D. ("Licensee") to practice medicine and surgery in the State of Kansas.
2. The Summary Order contained a notice that a written request for hearing could be filed within 15 days following service, but if no hearing is requested, the Summary Order would be come effective as a final order of the Board upon expiration of the time for requesting a hearing.
3. No hearing has been requested by any party therefore the Summary Order became effective as a Final Order on September 29, 2009.
4. Therefore, Licensee is hereby placed on **PROBATION** for a term of one year, commencing from the effective date of this order. The terms of such probation shall be as follows:
 - a. Licensee is hereby required to fully and promptly comply with all requirements

related to the production and maintenance of medical records. License shall provide the Board quarterly reports verifying whether she has created and maintained medical records as required.

b. Licensee is hereby required to complete a course in medical record keeping. This course must be preapproved by the Board and must be completed no later than six months from the effective date of this order.

c. Licensee is responsible for all costs associated with the terms of this probation, including but not limited to costs associated with the educational requirements.

d. This probationary period is not self-limiting. Upon successful completion of the probationary period the licensee may petition the Board for termination of the probation.





SUMMARY ORDER

NOW ON THIS 10th day of September, 2009, this matter comes before John (Jack) Confer, Executive Director, Kansas State Board of Healing Arts (“Board”), in summary proceedings pursuant to K.S.A. 77-537. This Summary Order shall become effective as a Final Order, without further notice, upon the expiration of the fifteen (15) day period if no request for hearing is made, pursuant to K.S.A. 77-542.

Upon review of the agency record and being duly advised in the premises, the following findings of fact, conclusions of law and order are made for and on behalf of the Board:

1. Corrie C. Nevil, M.D. (“Licensee”) was originally issued license number 04-28366 to practice as a medical doctor in the state of Kansas August 14, 1999. Licensee’s license is active, having last been renewed on or about July 1, 2009.

2. Licensee’s last known mailing address as provided to the Board at the time of her renewal is (confidential) Holton, Kansas 66436.

Licensee was placed on corrective action monitoring for twelve months (confidential)

4. Licensee was issued a letter of reprimand by Wesley Medical Center (confidential)

5. On April 16, 2008, Clifford Hacker, Board Investigator, mailed a certified letter to Licensee requesting a response to the allegations, this letter was returned to the Board office as Licensee was no longer at that location. On April 25, 2008, Investigator Hacker, again mailed a certified letter to Licensee requesting a response to the allegations, this letter was returned to the Board office as unclaimed, unable to forward. Investigator Hacker sent a third letter to Licensee on June 6, 2008, requesting a response to the allegations. The response was due no later than June 20, 2008.

6. On June 25, 2008, a response was received from Licensee. (confidential)

8. All pending investigation materials regarding Licensee were fully reviewed and considered by the Board members who serve on the Board's Disciplinary Panel. Disciplinary Panel #24 authorized and directed the issuance of this Summary Order and the specific disciplinary

sanctions pursuant to Board Guidelines.

Applicable Law

9. K.S.A. 65-2836 states, in pertinent part: A licensee's license may be revoked, suspended, or limited or the licensee may be publicly or privately censured, or an application for license or for reinstatement of a license may be denied upon finding of the existence of any of the following grounds:
- (k) The licensee has violated any lawful rule or regulation promulgated by the board or violated any lawful order or directive of the board previously entered by the board.
- (s) Sanctions or disciplinary actions have been taken against the licensee by a peer review committee, health care facility, a governmental agency or department or a professional association or society for acts or conduct similar to acts or conduct which would constitute grounds for disciplinary action under this section.
10. K.A.R. 100-24-1 states, in pertinent part: (c) Each entry shall be authenticated by the person making the entry unless the entire patient record is maintained in the licensee's own handwriting. (e) For the purposes of implementing the healing arts act and this regulation, an electric patient record shall be deemed a written patient record if the electronic record is authenticated by the licensee.

Conclusions of Law

11. The Board has jurisdiction over Licensee as well as the subject matter of this proceeding, and such proceeding is held in the public interest.
12. The Board finds that Licensee violated K.S.A. 65-2836(k), K.S.A 65-2836(s) and K.A.R. 100-24-1 (confidential)

13. Based on the facts and circumstances set forth herein, it appears that the use of summary proceedings in this matter is appropriate, in accordance with the provisions set forth in K.S.A. 77-537(a), in that the use of summary proceedings does not violate any provision of the

law and the protection of the public interest does not require the Board to give notice and opportunity to participate to persons other than Licensee, Corrie C. Nevil, M.D.

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED that Licensee is hereby placed on **PROBATION** for a term of one year, commencing from the effective date of this order. The terms of such probation shall be as follows:

1. Licensee is hereby required to fully and promptly comply with all requirements related to the production and maintenance of medical records. Licensee shall provide the Board quarterly reports verifying whether she has created and maintained medical records as required.

2. Licensee is hereby required to complete a course in medical record keeping. This course must be preapproved by the Board and must be completed no later than six months from the effective date of this order.

3. Licensee is responsible for all costs associated with the terms of this probation, including but not limited to costs associated with the educational requirements.

4. This probationary period is not self-limiting. Upon successful completion of the probationary period the licensee may petition the Board for termination of the probation.

NOTICE AND OPPORTUNITY FOR HEARING




