FINAL ORDER

NOW ON THIS Twenty-seventh day of June, 1997, comes before the Kansas State Board of Healing Arts (hereinafter, "Board") the Petition to Revoke, Suspend, or Otherwise Limit Licensure of Daniel C. Parra, M.D. Kevin K. LaChance, Disciplinary Counsel, appears for the Board. Respondent Dr. Parra appears in person and through Thomas E. Wright, Attorney at Law.

The Board takes official notice of its prior proceedings, including case numbers 92-00099 and 92-00127.

After hearing the arguments of counsel, and having the record before it, the Board finds as follows:

1 Dr. Parra is licensed by the Board to practice medicine and surgery, having been issued license number 04-20059.

2 On December 20, 1996, Dr. Parra appeared before The Honorable John J. McNally, District Court Judge for Wyandotte County, Kansas, and pleaded no contest to five counts of sexual battery, a class A (person) misdemeanor.

3 Based upon the plea of no contest, Dr. Parra was found guilty on all five counts.

4 Each of the instances of sexual battery occurred while Dr. Parra provided professional services to the female victims in scope of the physician - patient relationship.

5. Dr. Parra has a prior history of professional boundary violations with female patients. On November 5, 1992, the Board accepted a stipulation and agreement with Dr. Parra


6. As provided in K.S.A. 1996 Supp. 65-2836(c), a license to practice a branch of the healing arts may be disciplined upon the finding that the licensee has been convicted of a class A misdemeanor, whether or not related to the practice of the healing arts.

7. Aggravating factors exist in this case. Prior attempts to protect the public from sexual boundary problems have been unsuccessful, and the violations breached the trust which is vital to the physician - patient relationship.

8. Dr. Parra requests leniency by the Board so that he may practice in a clinic treating male impotency. The scope of employment is expected to be limited to telephone consultation with male patients, specifically as support and not as treatment. However, as long as the consultation does not involve the practice of the healing arts as defined by statute, a license to practice medicine and surgery is not needed.

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED THAT the license of Dr. Daniel C. Parra, M.D. is revoked.
