SUMMARY ORDER

NOW ON THIS ______ day of _______ 2019, this matter comes before Kathleen Selzler Lippert, Executive Director, Kansas State Board of Healing Arts ("Board"), in summary proceedings pursuant to K.S.A 77-537.

Pursuant to K.S.A 77-542, this Summary Order shall become effective as a Final Order, without further notice, if no written request for hearing is made within 15 days of service. Upon review of the agency record and being duly advised in the premises, the following findings of fact, conclusions of law, and order are made for and on behalf of the Board:

Findings of Fact

- 1. Licensee is entitled to engage in the practice of physician assistant in the state of Kansas, having been issued License No. 15-00115 on or about June 20, 1979.
 - 2. Licensee's license status is currently Active.
- 3. Licensee's mailing address is 10111 E. 21st St. N, Suite 315, Wichita, Kansas, 67206.
- 4. From approximately 2013 to 2015, Licensee was the sole owner of Age Reversal Technologies ("ART"), a Kansas limited liability company.
- 5. From approximately 2013 to 2015, ART provided medical services, to include preventative medicine, aesthetic services, and medical weight loss.

- 6. From approximately 2013 to 2015, Licensee's supervising physician was also ART's employee.
- 7. As of approximately 2015, ART no longer provided medical services and Licensee's supervising physician was not ART's employee.

Applicable Law

- 8. K.S.A. 65-28a13(a) provides: "The state board of healing arts shall adopt rules and regulations to limit the percentage of ownership when a licensed physician assistant forms a professional corporation pursuant to K.S.A. 17-2706 et seq., and amendments thereto, in combination with other professional services"
- 9. K.A.R. 100-28a-18(a) provides: "Licensed physician assistants shall not hold more than 49 percent of the total number of shares issued by a professional corporation that is organized to render the professional services of a physician, surgeon or doctor of medicine, or osteopathic physician or surgeon."
- 10. K.A.R. 100-28a18(b) provides: "Licensed physician assistants shall not contribute more than 49 percent of the total amount of capital to a professional liability company that is organized to render the professional services of a physician, surgeon or doctor of medicine, or osteopathic physician or surgeon."

Conclusions of Law

- 11. The Board has jurisdiction over Licensee as well as the subject matter of this proceeding and such proceeding is held in the public interest.
- 12. The use of summary proceedings in this matter is in accordance with the provisions set forth in K.S.A. 77-537(a), in that the use of summary proceedings does not violate any

provision of law and the protection of the public interest does not require the Board to give notice

and opportunity to participate to persons other than Licensee.

The Board finds Licensee violated K.A.R. 100-28a-18(a) and K.A.R. 100-28a-13.

18(b), when, from approximately 2013 to 2015, Licensee solely owned ART, a business entity that

rendered the professional services of a physician.

IT IS ORDERED that Licensee is PUBLICLY CENSURED.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that Licensee must attend and successfully complete

CPEP's PROBE: Ethics & Boundaries Program, on or before June 15, 2019, unless otherwise

approved by the Board. Licensee shall provide proof of successful completion of the program

within 30 days of completing the program. All costs associated with such program shall be at

Licensee's own expense and include, but are not limited to. the cost of the program, the cost of

travel to and from the courses, and the cost of accommodations while attending the program. These

hours shall be in addition to those continuing education hours required for renewal of licensure.
