JOURNAL ENTRY OF SATISFACTION OF CONSENT ORDER

COMES NOW the Kansas State Board of Healing Arts ("Board"), by and through its Executive Director, Kathleen Selzler Lippert, a duly authorized representative of the Board, in accordance with the provisions of the Kansas Administrative Procedure Act, K.S.A. 77-501 *et seq.*, as amended, and upon due consideration of the agency record and applicable statutes and regulations, and being otherwise duly advised in the premises, makes the following determinations:

1. On or about December 6, 2011, Licensee entered into a Consent Order with the Board for alleged violations of the Kansas Healing Arts Act, K.S.A. 65-2801, *et seq.* The Consent Order required that Licensee attend and successfully complete a continuing educational course for ethical advertising, a continuing educational course in radiologic diagnostics, and a continuing education course for medical record keeping, and to provide the Board documentation evidencing completion of the same by May 30, 2012. Further, the Consent Order assessed a civil fine, pursuant to K.S.A. 65-2863a, against Licensee in the amount of \$500.00, which was due in full to the Board by November 15, 2011.
2. On or about November 4, 2011, Licensee remitted full payment in the amount of \$500.00 to the Kansas State Board of Healing Arts.
3. On or about February 20, 2012, Licensee submitted documentation evidencing

completion of "Radiologic Technology" course presented by the Kansas Chiropractic Association.

4. On or about February 20, 2012, Licensee submitted documentation evidencing completion of "Documentation, Billing, Coding and Compliance" presented by Northwestern Health Sciences University Department of Continuing Education.

5. On or about April 16, 2012, Board Designee Gary Counselman, D.C., modified the requirement regarding ethical advertising of the Consent Order. Dr. Counselman amended requirements of the Consent Order based on the lack of a continuing education course for ethical advertising.


6. The new requirements for the Consent Order required Licensee to write an essay addressing the alleged violation of the Healing Arts Act, the pertinent statutes and regulations, as well as how those laws relate to the advertisement at issue. Further, the essay was to address how the advertisement should have been written and how Licensee intended on making sure that Licensee did not violate the advertising statutes and regulations again.

7. On or about May 11, 2012, Licensee submitted the required essay to the Board.

8. Licensee has satisfactorily met all requirements of the Consent Order and has no further obligation for compliance.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that Licensee is hereby discharged from all requirements of the Consent Order filed on December 6, 2011.
