FINAL ORDER

NOW on this 3rd day of June, 1994, comes on for consideration before the Kansas State Board of Healing Arts ("Board") sitting as a whole as Presiding Officer in a conference proceeding pursuant to the provisions of K.S.A. 77-533 through 77-535, the application of Tamea Sisco-Skinner, D.C. ("Applicant") for licensure by endorsement. Gretchen E. Schmidt, Associate Counsel, appears for and on behalf of the Board. Applicant appears in person and by and through her attorney, Donald G. Strole.

After reviewing the application and being otherwise duly advised in the premises, the Board finds as follows:

1. On July 30, 1993, Applicant submitted her application for licensure by endorsement to practice chiropractic in the State of Kansas. Said application was deemed complete on April 29, 1994.

2. Based upon information provided by Applicant in her application for licensure, the Board conducted an investigation into Applicant's affirmative answer to question number 11 of section VI of the application, namely that she had been notified of charges or complaints filed against her by another licensing or disciplinary agency. Such investigation revealed Applicant has been and is currently under investigation by the State of Colorado Department of Regulatory

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Agencies. The Colorado Chiropractic Board has referred its investigation of Applicant to the Colorado Attorney General for disciplinary proceedings with the recommendation of revocation of Applicant's Colorado chiropractic license.

3. The alleged acts and conduct of Applicant which serve as the basis of the Colorado Chiropractic Board's referral of its investigation of Applicant to the Attorney General may constitute grounds for denial of licensure in the State of Kansas pursuant to K.S.A. 65-2836.

4. Applicant agrees to waive any time limits for processing of applications prescribed by K.S.A. 77-511.

IT IS THEREFORE BY THE BOARD ORDERED as follows:

(A) That the findings herein above made be in the same are made the Order of the Board.

(B) That Applicant is hereby granted a temporary permit to practice chiropractic in the State of Kansas effective June 3, 1994 and expiring June 3, 1995. Applicant's application for permanent licensure is hereby tabled for said period of time or until Applicant or the Board petitions for earlier review if the State of Colorado disposes of its administrative proceeding involving Applicant.

(C) This is a Final Order and is effective upon service upon the parties. Any party may, within 15 days after service, file a Petition for Reconsideration. The filing of a Petition for Reconsideration is not a prerequisite for seeking administrative or judicial review.

IT IS SO ORDERED.
