NOW, on this 8th day of June, 1991, comes on for conference proceedings the request of Debra S. Stuart (hereafter "Registrant") to grant Second Temporary Permit pursuant to K.S.A. 65-2896d.

Registrant appears in person <u>pro se</u>. Steve A. Schwarm, Litigation Counsel to the Board, appears on behalf of the Board. There are no other appearances.

After reviewing the files, hearing statements of Registrant and being duly advised in the premises, the Kansas State Board of Healing Arts (hereafter "Board) makes the following findings of facts, conclusions of law and order:

A request for a Second Temporary Permit was filed by Debra
S. Stuart on April 13, 1991.

2. Notice of Conference Hearing setting this matter for hearing at 9:00 a.m. on June 8, 1991 was filed herein on May 24, 1991 and served on Registrant on May 24, 1991.

3. Registrant has applied for permanent registration as a physician assistant, but has not passed an exam approved by the Board as required by K.S.A. 1990 Supp. 65-2896a(a)(3).

4. Registrant was granted Temporary Registration No. H-44152 which expires on August 15, 1991.

5. Pursuant to K.S.A. 1990 Supp. 65-2896d, not more than one Temporary Registration shall be permitted to any one person without the majority approval of the members of the Board.

6. Upon payment of the appropriate fee, Registrant should be granted a Second Temporary Registration until the Board results from the NCCPA examination to be administered in October, 1991 become available.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that, upon payment of the appropriate fee, a Second Temporary Registration be granted to Debra S. Stuart until the Board receives results from the NCCPA examination to be administered in October, 1991 become available.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that in the event Registrant fails to pass the NCCPA examination to be administered in October, 1991, the Second Temporary Registration hereby granted to Registrant should expire and be cancelled as of the date the failure becomes available to the Board.

IT IS FURTHER ORDERED that this is a Final Order and is effective upon service upon the parties. Any party may, within 15 days after service, file a Petition for Reconsideration. The filing of a Petition for Reconsideration is not a prerequisite for seeking administrative or judicial review.

IT IS SO ORDERED.
