**FINAL ORDER AND JOURNAL ENTRY OF SATISFACTION
OF REQUIREMENTS OF FINAL ORDER**

NOW ON THIS 13th day of October, 2009, the above-entitled matter comes on before John (Jack) Confer, Executive Director of the Kansas State Board of Healing Arts (“Board”). After reviewing the file and being duly advised in the premises, the Executive Director makes the following determinations.

1. On September 17, 2009, the Executive Director issued a Summary Order regarding the license of Chrissy Denise Usher, O.T. (“Licensee”) to practice as an occupational therapist in the state of Kansas. The Summary Order contained a provision assessing a \$150 civil fine against Licensee for engaging in unprofessional conduct, due and payable within thirty (30) days of the effective date of the Summary Order.
2. The Summary Order contained a notice that a written request for hearing could be filed within 15 days following service, but if no hearing is requested, the Summary Order would be come effective as a final order of the Board upon expiration of the time for requesting a hearing.
3. No hearing has been requested by any party; therefore the Summary Order became effective as a Final Order on October 5, 2009.
4. On September 29, 2009, Licensee remitted \$150.00 to the Board for satisfaction of the \$150 civil fine.

5. Licensee has satisfied all requirements of the Final Order and has no further obligation for compliance.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that Licensee is hereby discharged from the requirements of the Final Order.





SUMMARY ORDER

NOW ON THIS 17th day of September, 2009, this matter comes before John (Jack) Confer, Executive Director, Kansas State Board of Healing Arts ("Board"), in summary proceedings pursuant to K.S.A. 77-537. This Summary Order shall become effective as a Final Order, without further notice, upon the expiration of the fifteen (15) day period if no request for hearing is made, pursuant to K.S.A. 77-542.

Upon review of the agency record and being duly advised in the premises, the following findings of fact, conclusions of law and order are made for and on behalf of the Board:

Findings of Fact

1. Chrissy Denise Usher, O.T. ("Licensee") was originally issued license number 17-00828 to practice as an occupational therapist in the State of Kansas on October 9, 1993. Licensee's license is currently active.
2. Licensee's last known mailing address as provided to the Board at the time of her application for reinstatement is 8108 W. Forest Park, Wichita, Kansas 67205.
3. On or about July 7, 2009, the Board received an application from Licensee for reinstatement of her occupational therapy license. Licensee's license had been cancelled for failure

to renew on May 1, 2009.

4. In her application, Licensee lists all professional activities since the cancellation of her license. Licensee states that she worked at Sedgwick County Area Educational Services Inter-local Coop #618 as an occupational therapist from May 1, 2009 to May 20, 2009.

5. Licensee in a request for further information stated that she worked as an occupational therapist and continued to treat students from May 1, 2009 until May 20, 2009. Licensee stated that all services were delivered by her and that she was not supervised by any other occupational therapist.

6. Licensee's license was reinstated on August 12, 2009. Licensee worked from May 1, 2009 until May 20, 2009 as an occupational therapist without being properly licensed or supervised by a licensed occupational therapist.

Applicable Law

7. K.S.A. 65-5410 states, in pertinent part: (a) The Board may deny, refuse to renew, suspend, revoke or limit a license or the licensee may be publicly or privately censured where the licensee or applicant for licensure has been guilty of unprofessional conduct which has endangered or is likely to endanger the health, welfare or safety of the public. Unprofessional conduct includes:

(2) being guilty of unprofessional conduct as defined by rules and regulations adopted by the board;

(c) The board, in addition to any other penalty prescribed in subsection (a), may assess a civil fine, after proper notice and an opportunity to be heard, against a licensee for unprofessional conduct in an amount not to exceed \$5000 for the first violation. . . .

8. K.A.R. 100-54-5. Unprofessional conduct; defined. "Unprofessional conduct" means any of the following: (o) committing conduct likely to

deceive, defraud or harm the public.

Conclusions of Law

9. The Board has jurisdiction over Licensee as well as the subject matter of this proceeding, and such proceeding is held in the public interest.

10. The Board finds that Licensee practiced as an occupational therapist without being licensed or properly supervised from May 1, 2009 until May 20, 2009.

11. The Board finds that by practicing as an occupational therapist without being properly licensed or supervised, Licensee engaged in conduct that could deceive, defraud or harm the public.

12. That by continuing to engage in the practice of occupational therapy from May 1, 2009 to May 20, 2009, without being properly licensed or properly supervised by a licensed occupational therapist, Licensee was in violation of K.S.A. 65-5410(a)(2) and K.A.R. 100-54-5 (o).

13. Based on the facts and circumstances set forth herein, it appears that the use of summary proceedings in this matter is appropriate, in accordance with the provisions set forth in K.S.A. 77-537(a), in that the use of summary proceedings does not violate any provision of the law and the protection of the public interest does not require the Board to give notice and opportunity to participate to persons other than Licensee, Chrissy Denise Usher, O.T.

IT IS, THEREFORE, ORDERED that Licensee is hereby assessed a civil fine of \$150 due and payable within thirty days of the effective date of this Order.

NOTICE AND OPPORTUNITY FOR HEARING

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that this is a Summary Order. A party to whom a Summary

Order is issued may file a written request for a hearing pursuant to K.S.A. 77-542 within 15 days following service of the Summary Order. Such written request shall also state the legal and/or factual basis upon which the party opposes this Order. If a hearing is not requested, the Summary Order shall become effective as a Final Order of the Board upon expiration of the time for requesting a hearing. A written request for hearing must be addressed and mailed to Jack Confer, Executive Director, Kansas State Board of Healing Arts, 235 S. Topeka Blvd., Topeka, KS 66603.

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that upon becoming effective as a Final Order, this document shall be deemed a public record and be reported to any reporting entities authorized to receive such disclosure.


