FINAL ORDER

NOW this 'd' day of May, 2009, the above captioned matter comes before the Kansas State Board of Healing Arts (Board), Ray Conley, D.C., Presiding Officer, on the Board staff's Motion to Lift Stay of Suspension and to Impose Suspension for Failure to Comply with Monitoring Terms. - 1. The Board issued a Final Order on March 3, 2008 suspending the respondent's license to practice chiropractic.

- 3. The respondent has failed to follow the Board's conditions outlined in the Final Order of March 3, 2008.

 - 5. The respondent did not respond to Board staff's Motion to Lift Stay.

The Presiding Officer concludes as a MATTER OF LAW:

1. The respondent has failed to abide by the Board's terms and conditions articulated in the Board's March 3, 2008 Final Order.

2. The respondent does not object to the Board lifting the stay of the March 3,

2008 Final Order.

WHEREFORE, Board staff's Motion to Lift Stay is GRANTED. The respondent,

Thomas C. Weaver, D.C.'s license to practice chiropractic is SUSPENDED pursuant to

the original term of suspension as issued by the Board.

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that this is a final order. A final order is effective

upon service. A party to an agency proceeding may seek judicial review of a final order

by filing a petition in the District Court as authorized by K.S.A. 77-601, et seq.

Reconsideration of a final order is not a prerequisite to judicial review. A petition for

judicial review is not timely unless filed within 30 days following service of the final

order. A copy of any petition for judicial review must be served upon Jack Confer, the
