STIPULATION

Now on the 11 day of May, 1982, an agreement is entered into by and between the State Board of Healing Arts, hereinafter known as H.A.B., and Robert B. White, M.D., hereinafter known as White.

WHEREAS, administrative hearing procedures were commenced and an evidentiary hearing concluded on or about the February 6, 1982; and,

WHEREAS, it is the intent and understanding of the parties hereto to join in full compliance with terms and conditions herein set forth; and,


NOW IT IS THEREFORE AGREED, and understood as follows:

- 1) That respondent will restrict his prescribing of controlled substances, as scheduled by D.E.A., to classes III, IV, and V, with the one exception that the controlled substance of Morphine and Demerol may be used only in a hospital setting;
- 2) That respondent will obtain postgraduate training of at least 40 hours specifically involving current use of steroids and ACTH, said training to be completed on or before October 1, 1982;
- 3) That respondent will provide adequate security for all prescription drugs in his office, subject to the Board's periodic review;
- 4) That White will comply fully with current regulations for dispensing physicians;
- 5) That the parties hereto are aware of and acknowledge receiving a Report of the Hearing Panel, which recommended the basis for the execution of this Stipulation;


6) That the parties understand and agree that upon full compliance with the terms and conditions set forth in this Stipulation, that White's license will remain in full force and effect;

7) The parties further understanding and agreeing that the above described terms and conditions are intended to be, and so understood by White, a lawful order or directive of the Board as set forth in K.S.A. 65-2836 (o), with it further being understood and agreed that should any of the terms and conditions be violated, the Board may, in its discretion, commence an administrative hearing pursuant to K.S.A. 65-2836 (o), among any and all other violations the Board might deem to be alleged should the Board feel probable cause exists.

It is the expressed hope of the parties hereto that the terms and conditions herein set forth are in the best interests of all parties and will be fully complied with.
