

4. Applicant successfully sat for the Missouri and national board exams in November, 1975. These exams did not test in the area of physiotherapy.
5. Applicant's continued practice of chiropractic in the State of Missouri demonstrates sufficient competence in chiropractic to constitute good cause to waive the requirement of sixty pre-chiropractic college hours.
6. Applicant states that if, at any time in the future, he adds physiotherapy to his practice, he intends first to obtain such additional education and training necessary to become competent in that area, and to pass the national board examination in physiotherapy.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that Applicant's request to waive the requirement of education and training in physiotherapy and to waive the requirement for sixty hours of college prior to admission to chiropractic school is granted and upon completion of all other requirements for license by endorsement, the application be submitted for approval at the next regular meeting of the Board.
