SUMMARY ORDER

NOW, on this 8th day of April 2006, comes on for summary proceedings before the Kansas State Board of Healing (“Board”) the Application for Licensure to practice medicine and surgery in the state of Kansas filed by John M. King, M.D. (“Applicant”). Charlene K. Abbott, Licensing Administrator, presented information to the Board.

After reviewing the file, hearing the presentation made by Ms. Abbott, and being duly advised in the premises, the Board finds, concludes and orders as follows:

1. On December 14, 2005, Applicant filed an Application for Licensure to receive a license to practice medicine and surgery in the state of Kansas.
2. As part of the Application, Applicant provided information that he had taken all or a portion of the three-part FLEX examination on four occasions in 1977 and 1978. The Board policy is that to successfully complete the three-part FLEX an applicant must receive a FLEX weighted average score of 75 on all three parts during the same sitting of the examination.
3. Applicant did not obtain a FLEX weighted average of 75 in one sitting. However, Applicant’s FLEX weighted average for parts 1 and 2 taken June 1978 and for part 3 taken December 1978 equate a total FLEX weighted average of 75.55.
4. Applicant has been granted licenses to practice medicine and surgery in the states of New York, New Jersey and California, which licenses are active and have never been limited, suspended or revoked.

5. While Applicant did not meet the requirements of the Board policy of passing all three parts of the three-part FLEX examination in one sitting, the Board finds that Applicant's licenses issued to him by New York, New Jersey and California were based the FLEX examination accepted by the Board and that the passing grade that was required by those states is comparable, if not identical, to that required by the Board.


6. Applicant is eligible for licensure by endorsement under the provisions of K.S.A. 65-2833.

IT IS THEREFORE ORDERED that the Applicant is eligible for endorsement and his Application for Licensure should be granted when presented to the Board for final action at its next regular meeting to be held June 10, 2006.

PLEASE TAKE NOTICE that this is a summary order. A party to whom a summary order is issued may file a written request for a hearing within 15 days following service of the summary order. If a hearing is not requested, the summary order shall become effective as a final order of the Board upon expiration of the time for requesting a hearing. 
